<p>Organisation's participation name</p>	<p>The name 'Russia' (or 'Russian' or any other derivative) shall not appear - in any language or format - in the designation of a Russian Athlete/Athlete Support Personnel (or in the designation of a delegation of Russian Athletes/Athlete Support Personnel). [...] including without limitation, on their clothes, equipment, or other personal items or in a publicly visible manner at any official venues or other areas controlled by the Signatory or its appointed Event organiser.</p>	<p>Athletes and team officials will represent the Russian Paralympic Committee and use "RPC" as the acronym, including for the marching order of the Opening Ceremony.</p> <p>All public displays of the organisation's participant name should use the acronym "RPC", not the full name "Russian Paralympic Committee".</p>
<p>Emblem</p>	<p>Russian Athletes/Athlete Support Personnel shall not display publicly the flag of the Russian Federation (current or historical), the name 'Russia' (in any language or format), or any national emblem or other national symbol of the Russian Federation, including without limitation, on their clothes, equipment, or other personal items or in a publicly visible manner at any official venues or other areas controlled by the Signatory or its appointed Event organiser.</p>	<p>A special RPC emblem has been created and should be used for Tokyo 2020 and Beijing 2022.</p> <p>This emblem can be used on uniforms, equipment, personal items, websites and in other areas relevant to the Games, so long as it is in line with the respective IPC guidelines.</p> <p>The emblem of the Russian Paralympic Committee:</p> <div data-bbox="1082 1599 1331 1899" data-label="Image"> </div>

<p>Flags (for ceremonies, in protocol sets and in-venue and TV graphics referring to athletes)</p>	<p>Russian Athletes/Athlete Support Personnel shall not display publicly the flag of the Russian Federation (current or historical), the name 'Russia' (in any language or format), or any national emblem or other national symbol of the Russian Federation, including without limitation, on their clothes, equipment, or other personal items or in a publicly visible manner at any official venues or other areas controlled by the Signatory or its appointed Event organiser.</p>	<p>A special RPC flag has been created based on the special emblem.</p> <p>This flag should be used in place of the flag of the Russian Federation at all Games venues and official ceremonies.</p> <div data-bbox="1043 517 1369 734" data-label="Image"> </div>
<p>Anthem</p>	<p>The Russian national anthem (or any anthem linked to Russia) shall not be officially played or sung at any official event venue or other area controlled by the Signatory or its appointed event organiser (including, without limitation, at medal ceremonies and opening/closing ceremonies).</p>	<p>Pyotr Tchaikovsky's Piano Concerto No.1 to be played for all ceremonies.</p>
<p>Uniforms/ clothing / equipment</p>	<p>Russian Athletes/Athlete Support Personnel shall participate in a neutral uniform to be approved by the relevant Signatory. To this end, the uniform shall not contain the flag, the colours of the flag (collectively or in combination), name (in any language or format), national emblem or other national symbol of the Russian Federation.</p>	<p>Russian flag or Russian Federation emblem/symbols will be replaced with the RPC emblem (if used).</p> <p>The words "Russia" and "Russian" shall not appear. If they do, it must appear with "Neutral Athlete".</p> <p>For sporting equipment that requires the use of the country's acronym, the RPC will be used instead of RUS.</p>
