Yuichi KIMURA



Taiko drummer born in Kobe. Made his professional debut as a performer in France in 1995, inspired by his uplifting performances for the victims of the Great Hanshin Earthquake. Since then, he has embarked on American tours and collaborated with numerous artists in both classical and jazz genres, creating music that transcends borders and styles.

Received accolades such as the Sakai Tokutada Music Award, the Kobe City Cultural Encouragement Award, and the Hyogo Prefecture Art Encouragement Award.

Suma Shofu High School Taiko Drum Club



Inherits its legacy from its predecessor, the Kobe City Kobe Nishi High School. Participated in various ceremonies and events, including the 2022 National Abundant Sea Creation Competition.

Wheelchair dancer and circus performer born in Kobe.

Known for acrobatic moves like handstands and aerial acts on his wheelchair which make full use of his upper body.

Performed at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympics opening ceremony, Rio 2016 Paralympics closing ceremony, and Korea International Accessible Dance Festival (KIADA 2019). He has also made various other appearances, such as lectures at schools, the NHK Kohaku Uta Gassen, and television commercials.

N'ism



Kobe-based dance performance group for the world directed by choreographer NORI, formed in 2018.

Performed in the Tokyo 2020 Paralympics closing ceremony.

Made history by winning the World of Dance Championships twice (2019, 2022). Won The Dance Day (Nippon TV) in 2023.

Kobe Noda High School Dance Club



Three times winner of the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology Award at the All-Japan High School and University Dance Festival (Kobe). Nine times winner of the Hyogo Prefecture High School Athletic Meet.

Received various prizes such as the Kobe City Sports Prize Kobe Youth Prize, and Marronnier Prize.
