<i>AAF</i>	<i>Adverse Analytical Finding</i>	<i>A report from a laboratory or other WADA approved testing entity that identifies in a specimen the presence of a prohibited substance or its metabolites or markers, or evidence of the use of a prohibited method.</i>
<i>ATF</i>	<i>Atypical Finding</i>	<i>A report from a laboratory or other WADA approved entity which requires further investigation as provided by the International Standard for Laboratories or related Technical Documents prior to the determination of an Adverse Analytical Finding.</i>
<i>ADRV</i>	<i>Anti-Doping Rule Violation</i>	<i>An AAF or ATF, or any other investigation that is not supported by a TUE or where no apparent departure of the applicable International Standards is derived.</i>

### IPC Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) Management in 2011

In total, IPC approved 13 TUEs for athletes that either belong to the IPC Registered Testing Pool or required emergency TUE management at the \*2011 Parapan American Games. No TUE applications were rejected.

- 2011 Asean Games, Solo, Indonesia – in cooperation with Lembaga Anti-Doping Indonesia (NADO Indonesia)
- 2011 IPC Sports Council, Beijing, China – IPSF World Anti-Doping Code compliance seminar

Additionally, the IPC, jointly with WADA, took a lead role in assisting International Paralympic Sport Federations to achieve World Anti-Doping Code compliance.
