# **1. ABOUT SARDINIA**

Sardinia is the second largest island in the Mediterranean after Sicily, with an area of 24,100.02 km2.

With its 1,897 km of coastline, it is the Italian region with the greatest coastal development. It has organized one of the most special and important open water events of the Italian Paralympic Swimming Federation for over 11 years: the Italian Open Water Para Swimming Championships.

Sardinia is a cradle surrounded by the sea where, eight thousand years ago, a mysterious and original civilization was born, brought by sea from the other side of the ancient Mediterranean, which is why it was open to innovations and cultural influences. The Sardinians built nuraghi (typical ancient megalithic buildings) along the coast with moorings for boats, joined together to guard the sea and connected to those built inland. The island's location is strategic: it is a bustling crossroads of trade routes frequented by seafaring peoples, including the highly evolved and peaceful Phoenicians who made their base in Sardinia. They founded what would be the most beautiful, cultured and wealthy cities of their time Sulci, Bithia, Nora, Tharros and Karaly. Goods, ideas and knowledge circulated freely among the Phoenician cities and Nuragic villages until the arrival of imperialist populations eager for new domains.

First came the Carthaginians, then fell the Romans and the Phoenician cities. The Sardinians reacted heroically, as in the "lost city" of Cornus, which was defended to the last breath by the Romans. For this, it was punished, destroyed and rebuilt. The most poignant of sunsets over the sea originates from its ruins, overlooking the Gulf of Cuglieri and the cliff of Santa Caterina di Pittinurri. The Romans expanded and built their city overlooking Asinara: beautiful and imperious emerged Turris Libisonis, today the center of Porto Torres. This is an area of La Sardegna where the early Sardinian and Nuragic civilization is best preserved. Here, a short distance from the sea, stands the ziggurat of Monte d'Accoddi. It is one of the oldest and most unusual monuments of European culture. The Romans built paved roads to better govern the territory and connect the conquered cities. One of them connected Nora to Bithia on the coast, and today it is a scenic tour through unspoiled landscapes, as it was when people traveled in ancient times.

# 6. RACE & PRICE AWARD CEREMONY

### **Competition field A**

San Teodoro's most famous beach, at one of the most beautiful naturalistic landscapes of the Mediterranean Sea, can be reached on foot from the northern part of the town. La Cinta makes a 5-km-long arcs of white and fine sand that gently slopes down to crystal blue sea. The beach smells of juniper, sea lily and helichrysum that garnish a pristine though very crowded still landscape. Its seabed is shallow and crystal clear. Families with children, young people and nature enthusiasts like this beach. La Cinta overlooks the sea, above Punta Coda Cavallo - Island of Tavolara, which rises above the bay with its majestic profile toward San Theodore Lagoon. Thanks to its environmentally respectful variety, this is a beautiful corner of biodiversity where relax and adventure perfectly combine.

### **Competition field B**

Lu Umpostu Beach: a kilometer long and very wide, this beach is made of fine dunes, soft, white and bright sand, dotted with junipers and mimosas, thistle and sea lilies. The water is crystal clear and reflects the sun's rays that bring out its various shades of blue and green. The seabed is shallow and sandy, especially suitable for children and slopes gently down to the lake.

### **COMPETITION FIELD B**



This event will be held together with the Italian Open Water Championship

The three first male and female athletes competing in the distance of 1.5 Km will awarded a medal. Also the three first male and female athletes competing in the distance of 3 Km will awarded a medal for each class group (S7 – S10 and S11 – S14), according to the weighted point table (hereby attached).

The athletes with N status can compete but they will not receive any medal.

# 7. ORGANIZATION

Since 2014, the AlbatroSS sports club has been organizing, in cooperation with the Italian Para Swimming Federation, the Italian Paralympic Open Water Swimming Championships. Such event, at the national level, will take place within the international one, as usual, this year as well. # 8. LOCATION

San Teodoro, **located in Gallura**, is a small town with just under 5,000 residents in the winter and thousands of tourists in the summer. This town was founded in the 17th century, inland on the eastern slope of Mount Nieddu, when shepherds and fishermen lived in this land, populated since ancient times. **The nuraghe** in the village of Naracheddu bears the best testimony to that origin. Already in Roman times there was a populated village whose **archaeological** finds are preserved in the Museo del Mare.

# **12. ENTRIES**

Entries will only be accepted through the WPS entry system: <u>https://db.ipc-services.org/sdms/app/login</u>

All the athletes should hold a valid WPS license for 2024 and classification (status Confirmed, Review, Review with and without fixed date and New, however please note athletes with New status will not be eligible for medals). This event is open to athletes who are 15 years or older.

The entry fee is  $\in$  75,00 per athlete (late entries will be charged  $\in$  20). It should be paid to the following bank details: (IBAN) **IT16M030690960610000077838** in the name of Albatross SSD Srl specifying the name of the participating athlete. No fees will be charged for staff members. Coaches are responsible for representing their swimmers at the Tehnical Meeting. The Technical Delegate of World Para Swimming together with the Head Referee will accept entries and register only swimmers accompanied by their respective coaches who are responsible for recognizing the swimmers during the competition.
