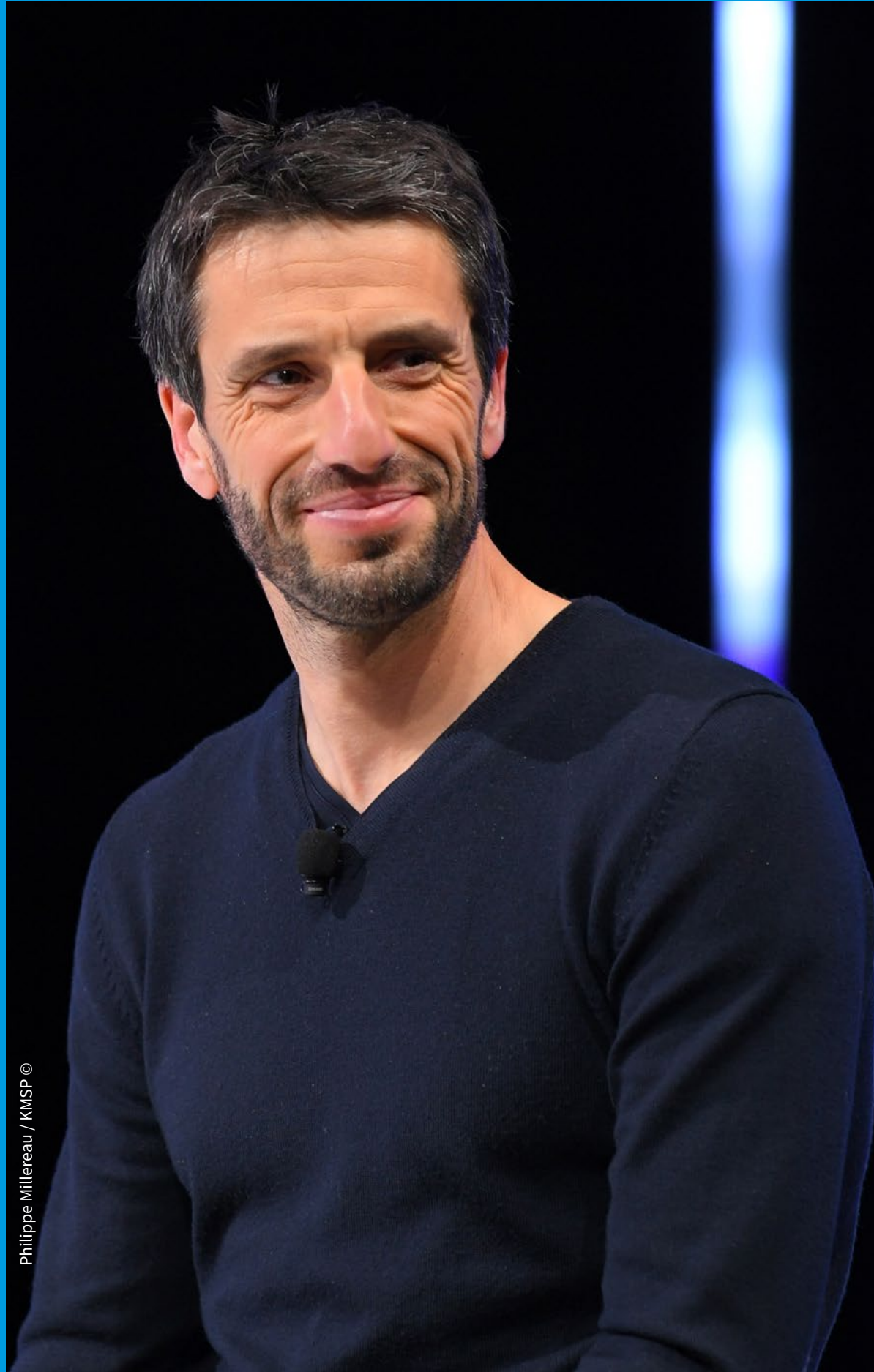
The IPC believes that Change Starts With Sport, and these Games have acted as a catalyst to making this country and city more inclusive and accessible.

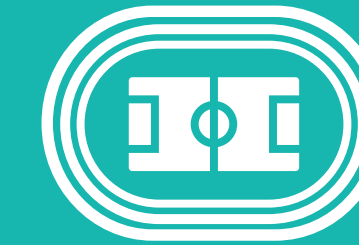

PARIS AND THE GAMES

Held for the first time in Paris, the Paralympic Games represent a historic moment for French capital and for the Paralympic Movement as a whole.

During the Tignes-Albertville 1992 Paralympic Winter Games, the city of Paris showed its very active support for the promotion of inclusion and accessibility for people with disabilities by providing adapted infrastructure and special welcome programmes, and raising public awareness of these issues. As the host city of the 2024 Paralympic Games, Paris is continuing its commitment to inclusion and equality by empowering Para athletes and supporting the development

of Para sports. By hosting this global event, Paris is offering a choice location for celebrating human potential and highlighting the Paralympic athletes' performances, while enhancing the recognition and value of the Paralympic brand. This new era in the history of the Paralympic Games is strengthening the ties between Paris and the Paralympic Movement, while underlining the importance of integration and accessibility in sport and society as a whole.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE SERVICES (AND)

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3.1

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE INFORMATION

3.1.1 POINTS OF ENTRY TO THE GAMES

Several airports and train stations are being used by Paris 2024 to welcome you and offer you services as soon as you arrive.

These services will vary depending on your point of arrival and the period in which you arrive. To benefit from this service, **all your arrival and departure details must be entered in the Arrival and Departure System (ADS) at least 48 hours before your arrival. Please contact your contact person to make sure that the information has been filled in correctly. In this respect, if a specific need linked to your accessibility is mentioned in the ADS, Paris 2024 will make a dedicated vehicle available to you.**

* For arrivals on the day of the opening ceremony (28/08), we recommend that you plan your arrival before 12 pm, due to road closures, airspace closures and reduced transport services. However, the following options are available for those arriving after 12 noon:

- Public transport
- A shuttle bus at 3 pm and 5 pm from Paris-Charles-de-Gaulle airport to Porte Maillot Hub, where the Paralympic Family hotel is located.
- One bus for groups of 25 people arriving at the same place and travelling to the same destination
- Official fleet of Paris 2024 vehicles for part of the Paralympic Family

*For assistance at the airport, check with your referee that they have filled in the ADS in time for the assistance service to be activated at the airports by the Paris 2024 team. For station assistance, reservations are your responsibility and must be made at least 24 hours before your arrival or departure on the Gares et Connexions website:

Paris 2024 does not undertake to provide services for changes made less than 48 hours before an arrival or departure.

3.1.2 DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO ENTER FRANCE

The following documents are required to enter French territory:

- A valid travel document;
- A visa allowing you to stay for the entire duration of your trip (excluding EU/Schengen countries and third countries benefiting from bilateral short-stay visa exemption agreements). For some of you, the visa may be the one provided by Paris 2024 and printed on the back of the Pre-Valid Card (PVC) you receive.

It is your responsibility to find out about your own situation and whether you need a visa before you travel. To check whether you need a visa, you can visit the France visa website (<https://france-visas.gouv.fr/en/web/france-visas/visa-wizard>).

If you have an identity document issued within the EU/Schengen zone, your travel document must be valid until the day of departure. However, **if you come from a third country**, this document must be valid **for at least three months after your departure date**. If you are applying for a Paris 2024 visa, as the Paralympic period ends on 08 October 2024, you will be required to present at the border a passport valid for at least a further three months, i.e. until 08 January 2025 at least.

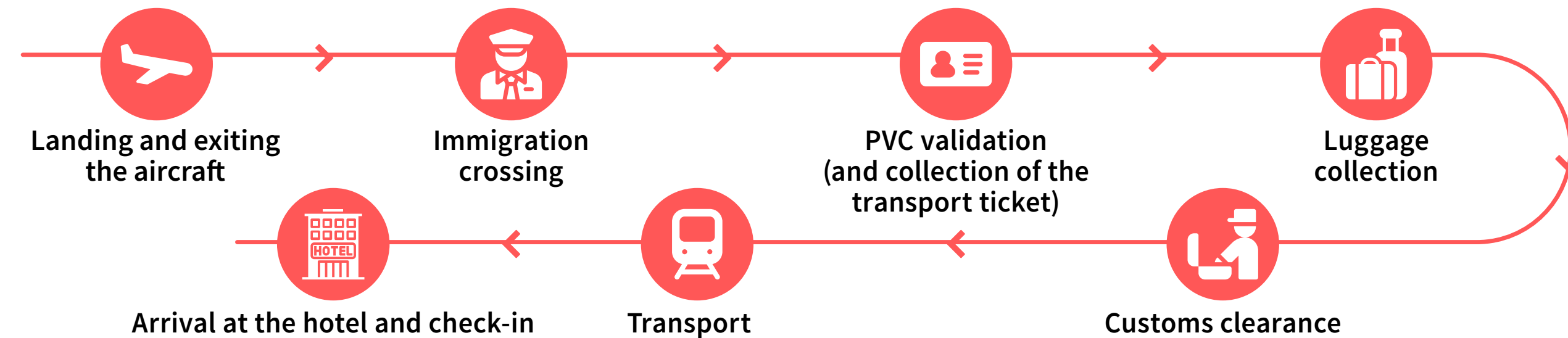

3.2

ARRIVAL PROCESS IN PARIS

3.2.1 AIRPORTS

Paris 2024 recommends that you use Paris Charles de Gaulle and Paris Orly airports for greater convenience. For all Paralympic Family customers, your arrival route will be as follows:



Welcoming the Paralympic Family

If you arrive at Paris Charles de Gaulle or Paris Orly airport, you will be met by volunteers present at strategic points to guide you through the airport between 6.30 am and 10.30 pm. Signage is also provided to help you find your way around. For immigration, you must follow the standard procedure with the border police. Once you have crossed the border, there is an office where you can have your accreditation validated, open between 7 am and 11 pm. You can also collect your public transport ticket there. Administrative assistance is provided in the event of lost, delayed or damaged luggage. The transport solutions available

to you are detailed in [section 3.2.5 Methods of transport to official hotels](#).

To answer your questions about the transport services available to your hotel, **a Paris 2024 information desk** is open between 6.30 am and 10.30 pm in each terminal after customs clearance.

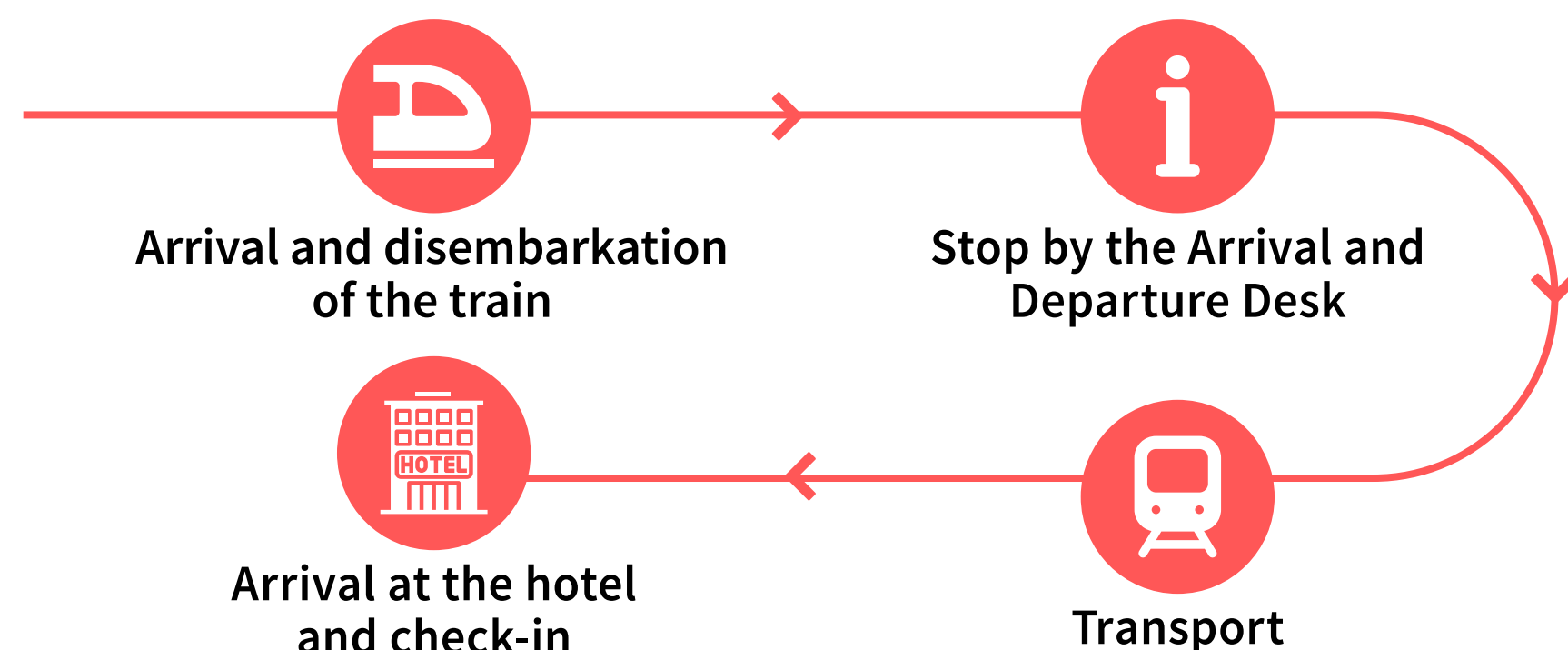
For overnight arrivals between 10:30 pm and 6:30 am, after baggage collection you will be met by a **taxi driver displaying a sign or tablet with your name – paid for by Paris 2024** - for departure to your accommodation. If your flight time does not allow you access to the accreditation office during its opening hours to validate your PVC and collect your public transport card,

you can go to an accreditation centre set up for this purpose. You can visit section [5.3 Installations & Services](#) to find all the accreditation centres and offices available and the services they offer.

It should be noted that certain members of the Paralympic Family benefit from personalised assistance between 6 am and 9:30 pm and priority lines at immigration and accreditation counters. Those booked in official hotels will be taken directly to their hotel accommodation.

3.2.2 TRAIN STATIONS

There is a special route from your arrival station to your accommodation:



Arrival

Once you arrive at the station, you can go to the Paris 2024 information desk at the end of the platform, open between 7:30 am and 10:30 pm, to collect a public transport ticket and obtain information about the transport services available to get you to your destination hotel. The transport solutions available to you are detailed in [section 3.2.5 Methods of transport to official hotels](#)

There is no accreditation desk at the station, but you can go to one of the counters set up for this purpose, as indicated in the next section.

Paris 2024 strongly recommends downloading the transport app provided especially for the Paralympic Games period. It is available in French, English and Spanish, and you can use it any time you need help with choosing the most efficient means of transport to reach your hotel. Please note that some members of the Paralympic Family will receive personalised assistance between 7:30 am and 10:30 pm, with direct transport to their accommodation for those staying in official hotels.

3.2.3 PRE-VALID CARD (PVC) VALIDATION DESK

There are a number of ways to have your PVC validated:

- If you are arriving by plane via Paris Charles de Gaulle or Paris Orly, Paris 2024 **encourages you to complete this validation process directly at your arrival airport**, at the **accreditation desk** provided for this purpose. This counter is accessible for PRMs and open from 18/08 to 08/09 from 7 am to 11 pm. Please note that **PVC validation is not available at other airports or train stations.**
- A second means of validating PVCs is available at the **Paralympic Family Hotel (PFH)**. You can find practical information about these accreditation services in the section reserved for the Paralympic Family Hotel, see [section 4.3.2 Services](#).
- You can also validate your PVC at another accreditation centre for the Paralympic Family. You can find full details of these accreditation centres in [section 5.3.1 Accreditation Centre for the Paralympic Family](#).

Don't forget to bring your passport or the identity document you filled in when applying for accreditation to validate and finalise the accreditation procedure.

As a reminder, presentation of the PVC is compulsory: without it, you cannot validate your accreditation, which is required for access to the various official competition and non-competition venues.

3.2.4 MISHANDLED BAGGAGE (LOST, DELAYED, DAMAGED)

At airports, if your baggage or wheelchair has been lost, delayed or damaged, dedicated administrative assistance to complete the relevant airline documents can be obtained at the arrivals and departures counter in the baggage reclaim area. In the event of loss or delay, the airline is responsible for delivering the baggage to your hotel and will contact you directly to do so.

You are responsible for your baggage at stations. If you lose it or have it stolen, you can go to the Arrivals & Departures desk for administrative assistance in declaring the loss. If your baggage is found, you will be responsible for recovering it.

Luggage tracking assistance is also available at the Paralympic Family hotel. You can find more information on this subject in [section 4.3.2 Services](#).

To reduce the risk of being inconvenienced in this way, we suggest affixing a label with your name and contact details to each piece of luggage.

3.2.5 METHODS OF TRANSPORT TO OFFICIAL HOTELS

There are various ways of getting to your hotel when you arrive in Paris. Some members of the Paralympic Family will be provided with a dedicated vehicle to reach their accommodation from all airports and train stations.

If a specific disability-related need is stated in the ADS, Paris 2024 will also provide you with a dedicated vehicle.

For the others, the modes of transport differ depending on the point of arrival, as shown in the table below. These include transport solutions during the day, between 6:30 am and 10:30 pm.

You can also find the estimated journey times to the centre of Paris, where the Paralympic Family hotel is located. Journey times are highly dependent on the traffic situation and the Olympic lanes used.

* A public transport ticket is provided at the Arrivals & Departures desk when you arrive at the station. For airport arrivals, a Navigo Easy pass is given to you when you validate your PVC, enabling you to benefit from free public transport services. The card activation period runs from 18 August to 11 September 2024 and covers all areas of the Greater Paris metropolitan area. **For other official hotels, transport options depend on the port of entry, the transport rights determined by your PVC and your place of accommodation. Paris 2024 recommends public transport services or Paris 2024 shuttles.

*** TC Paris 2024 shuttle services include regular shuttles and bus routes linking the Paris 2024 transport hubs and public transport stations to the official accommodation venues. This service operates from 6:30 am (1st shuttle) to 10:30 pm (last shuttle), with varying frequencies depending on the date, as shown in the table below:

For arrivals between 10:30 pm and 6:30 am, a Paris 2024 partner vehicle will take you from the Port of Entry to your official accommodation. At airports, a driver will be waiting for you outside the baggage reclaim area with a sign, and at stations, a member of the Paris 2024 team will direct you to your vehicle. To benefit from this service, please check with your contact person that your information is correctly registered in ADS.

For groups of more than 25 people, Paris 2024 will provide a dedicated bus for arrivals from the same group arriving on the same flight or train and going to the same accommodation. The relevant information must be entered in the ADS at least 48 hours before your arrival. No further action is required on the part of the customer to obtain it. They will have to go to the Welcome Desk to be redirected to the right method of transport.

For stand-alone inputs: Please note that there will be no dedicated assistance if you decide to make your own way to your accommodation. If this applies to you, please do remember to enter your arrival information in the ADS, along with your licence plate details.

There is no security perimeter around the Paralympic Family hotel, so you can get there in your own vehicle. Please note that there are no reserved parking spaces in the vicinity of the hotel.

Traffic around the Paralympic Family Hotel is restricted on the days of the Opening and Closing Ceremonies, and it is necessary to have a VAPP (Vehicle Access Point and/or Parking Permit) dedicated to these ceremonies to gain access.

DEPARTURE PROCESS

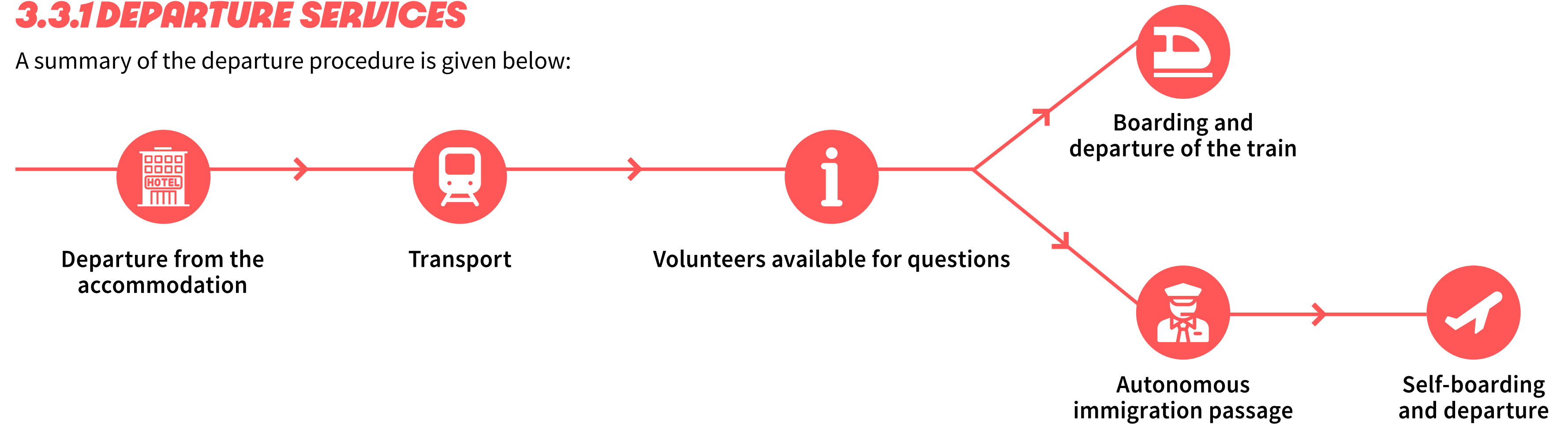
Below are some important recommendations concerning your arrival times at stations and airports, depending on your departure time:

It is the passenger's responsibility to take all the necessary measures to get to the airport in good time and in accordance with airline recommendations, taking into account any unforeseen events that may occur. Paris 2024 is not responsible for the possible consequences of delays or other unforeseen circumstances occurring during transport to the airport, by whatever means, particularly in the event of a missed flight by the traveller. Paris 2024 will not be held responsible for any delayed or missed flights or trains.

3.3.1 DEPARTURE SERVICES

A summary of the departure procedure is given below:



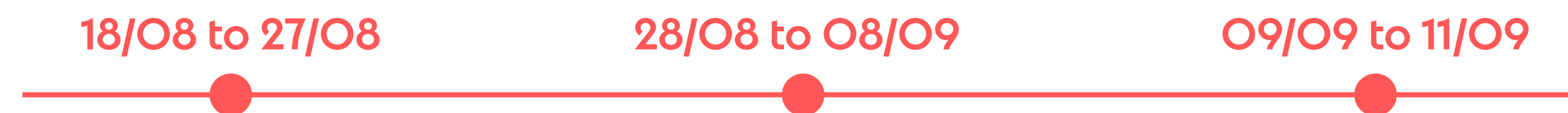
For **TX users** (transport system explained in [section 6.4 TX Services](#)), the following transport solutions are available to reach your departure destination between 18 August and 11 September:

*To recognise your TXB, you'll find the vehicle identity number in the application, which you'll find affixed to the vehicle's front and rear windscreens.

**The TXB is available between 11 pm and 7 am and must be booked by calling the Call Centre on +33 (0)9 69 37 07 24 or via the transport accred application (see information in [section 6.7.2 Application Paris 2024 Transport Accred](#)).

For **other TC and TP customers**, transport solutions for departures are divided into three periods spread over the duration of the Games:



It should be noted that over all periods:

- Confirmation of your appointment time for the dedicated vehicles and shuttles will be sent to you using the information provided in the ADS.
- All customers with an accessibility requirement listed in the ADS will receive a dedicated accessible vehicle.
- **For night departures (between 10:30 pm and 6:30 am)**, you must enter your departure details in the ADS so that Paris 2024 can book you a taxi, accessible if required, to pick you up in front of your hotel.
- Based on the information provided in the ADS, Paris 2024 will provide a direct bus from your hotel on the day of departure for groups of more than 25 people travelling to the same airport or station (except from Porte Maillot), 24 hours a day.

Tax refunds at Paris airports

“Tax refund” kiosks are available in all terminals at Paris Charles de Gaulle and Paris Orly airports, enabling you to obtain a tax refund directly and have the VAT on your purchases reimbursed. You can also claim back VAT using a paper duty-free slip: just insert your envelope containing all the necessary documents into one of the “mailboxes” provided. Finally, there is also a duty-free office staffed by customs officers, which is clearly indicated in each terminal.

At Paris Le Bourget airport, you must apply for the tax refund directly at the customs office near the Road Security Checkpoint (Poste d'Accès Routier d'Inspection Filtrage – PARIF), making sure you have the products purchased with you when claiming the refund.

3.4

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES IN CHÂTEAUROUX

If you are eligible for the TX transport service, you can book your travel to or from a departure point on the official destination list shown in [Appendix 1](#) (Châteauroux station and the Châteauroux National Shooting Centre, for example). Please note that the TX service is not available for travel between Châteauroux and Paris and vice versa.

For customers who are not eligible for the TX transport service, you can contact your contact person to enter your details in the ADS system and benefit from a Paris 2024 transport service.

**Persons with disabilities (PHMR)
with special requirements**

Specific transport services:

Depending on the information provided in the ADS, customers with disabilities (PHMR) and special needs have access to an accessible vehicle for arrival and departure transfers:

For wheelchair users who cannot be transferred to a car seat **and/or whose wheelchair cannot be loaded** into the boot of a car (e.g. motorised or non-folding), an accessible Paris 2024 transfer (TPRM - **Transport for People with Reduced Mobility**) is provided for arrivals and departures between the airport or arrival station and the official Paris 2024 accommodation for the duration of the activation of the arrival and departure services.

For people using a wheelchair who can transfer into a car seat **and whose wheelchair can be loaded** into a car boot, and people with a physical impairment without a wheelchair, a vehicle with low seats (Toyota Mirai or Toyota BZ4X type car) will be provided for the transfer between the arrival airport or station and the official Paris 2024 accommodation for the entire duration of the activation of arrivals and departures services.

Exception:

- TC/TP users when the Paris 2024 TC shuttles are available for the entire route to the accommodation.
- People with disabilities (PHMR) are strongly encouraged to use Paris 2024 transport services for arrivals and departures, as these have been specifically designed to best meet their needs. Apart from these services provided by Paris 2024, there is no guarantee as to the level of accessibility of available places and services.

Assistance services for people with specific disability-related needs at airports and train stations:

Airports: be sure to book the appropriate service with the airline and correctly enter the information for the person concerned in the ADS.

Train stations: whatever company you are travelling with and however you have booked your train tickets, please book the assistance service at the station on the Gares et Connexions website (<https://www.garesetconnexions.sncf/en/customer-service/PRM-train-station-assistance-service/book>) and correctly enter the information for the person concerned in the ADS.

All train stations and airports are equipped with accessible toilets, indicated on the route between the load zones and the plane/train. Although not always indicated on directional signs, all airport toilet blocks are equipped with toilets that are accessible to people with reduced mobility.

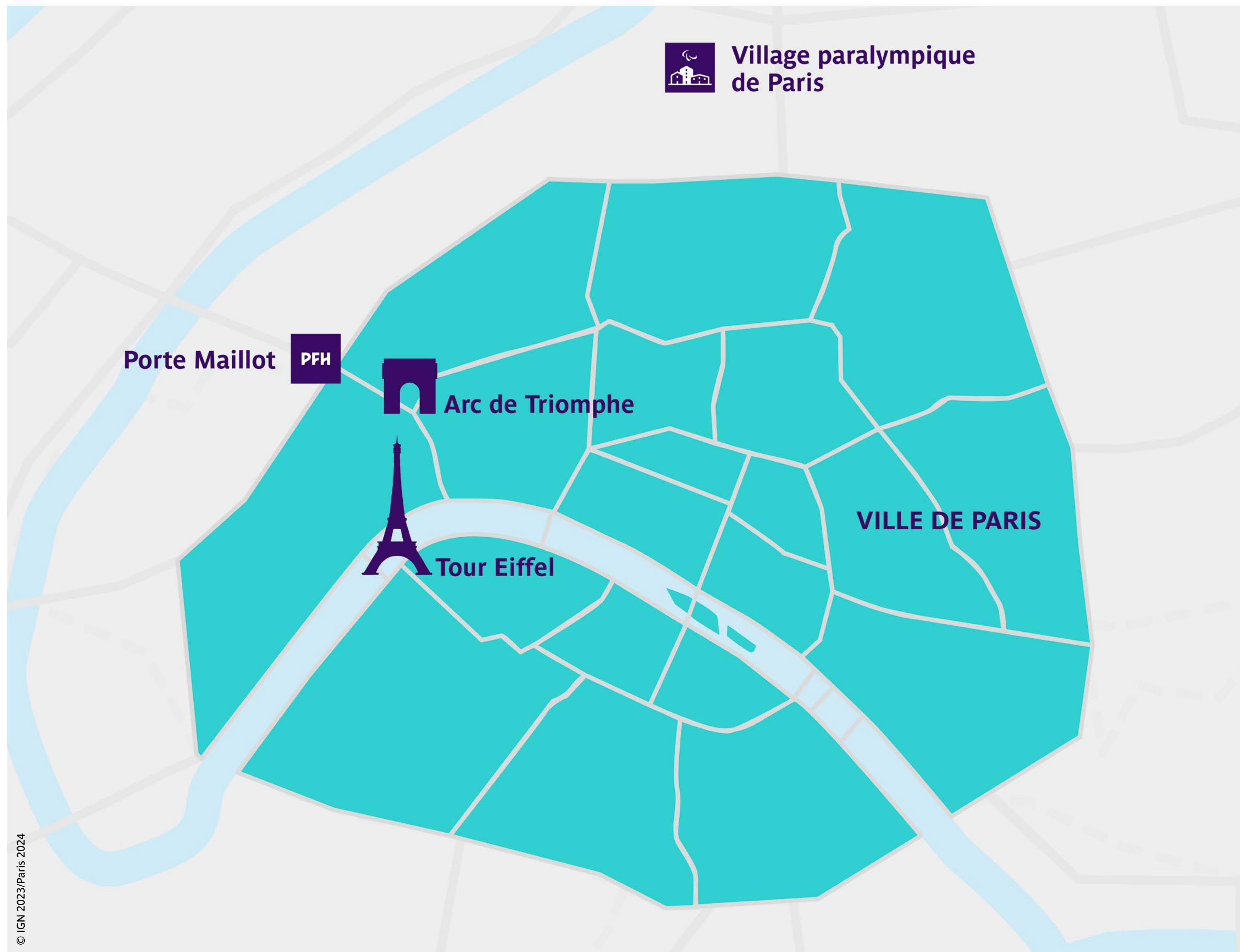

5.1

DEFINITION OF ACCREDITATION

The Paralympic Identity and Accreditation Card (PIAC), more commonly known as accreditation, entitles its holder to carry out their duties for the duration of the Paralympic Games.

The PIAC serves as your “identity card” during the Games, and you must carry it with you to gain access to the official competition and non-competition venues. It can also be used as a visa for entry into France when a visa number is printed on it and it is accompanied by your passport or other official travel document. This type of visa authorises multiple entries into France between 28 July and 8 October 2024, for a maximum stay of 90 days in a 180-day period.

Before being validated at a Paris 2024 Accreditation Centre, the PIAC is called a Pre-Valid Card (PVC) and does not allow access to the Games venues. Once validated, the PVC becomes your official nominative accreditation for the duration of the Paralympic Games.



5.2

ACCREDITATION VALIDATION PROCESS

As soon as you arrive in France, you must go in person to an official Games accreditation site with your passport or identity document, in its original version, which you filled in when you applied for accreditation, in order to validate and finalise the accreditation procedure. PVCs can be validated, at one of the centres or offices mentioned in [section 5.3.1: Accreditation Centre for the Paralympic Family](#), until the day of the Paralympic Games closing ceremony, 8 September 2024. When your accreditation is validated, you will be issued with a Navigo Easy pass (for more information, see [section 6.2 Service TP \(Transport Public\) de la région Ile-de-France](#)) so that you can use public transport during the Games. Please note that the Accreditation Centres do not offer transport assistance services and that any problems relating to transport should be referred to the transport information desks.

PROCESS TO FOLLOW IF YOUR ACCREDITATION IS LOST, STOLEN OR DAMAGED

If your accreditation card is lost, stolen or damaged, please go to the nearest accreditation centre/VAHO (accreditation office). Your identity will be checked there, and you will be asked to fill in a lost or stolen form. If your PIAC is damaged and becomes illegible, it can be reissued at the nearest accreditation centre or VAHO.

Please note that PVCs or accreditation cards can only be reissued during the times of operation of the accreditation centres or VAHOs. PVCs and/or PIACs will not be reissued after 09 September 2024.

GUEST PASS FOR THE PARALYMPIC VILLAGES AND MAIN PRESS CENTRE (MPC)

For accredited persons who do not have MPC access on their accreditation, and who need access to the Main Press Center (MPC), an MPC Guest Pass will be required.

Guest Passes can be requested by people accredited for the MPC, on behalf of the guest, by sending an email to MPCGuestpass@paris2024.org or by visiting the MPC Guest Pass office, located at the headquarters of the organising committee (Pulse) at 46 rue Proudhon, Saint-Denis. Requests will be processed and approved by the Press Operations teams.

All MPC Guest Pass applicants will have to undergo screening. Requests must therefore be submitted as early as possible, and no later than 10:00 am on the day before the date in question. If the guest is already accredited, but does not have "MPC" on their accreditation, the request can be submitted until 6 pm on the previous day.

MPC Guest Passes are valid for one day only and are not transferable. Guests are not required to return them when they leave the MPC. A Guest Pass does not replace accreditation. Requests are approved up to a limit of five Guest Passes for any one guest. Applications exceeding this quota will be rejected.

Guests must collect their Guest Pass in person, by presenting a valid identity card or passport.

OVERVIEW OF TRANSPORT SERVICES

Paris 2024 offers the following transport services throughout the Paralympic territory (Greater Paris and Châteauroux):

As part of the New Standard, the IOC, IPC and Paris 2024 are committed to making the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games more responsible. With this ambition in mind, the transport plan encourages the use of public transport, both for spectators and for accredited persons.

TP (PUBLIC TRANSPORT) SERVICE FOR THE ILE-DE-FRANCE/ PARIS REGION

6.2.1 SERVICE OVERVIEW

The Ile-De-France region, surrounding Paris, boasts a highly efficient public transport system (metro, bus, trams, Réseau Express Régional (RER) and “noctilien” night buses) providing access to competition and non-competition venues.


You can use public transport free of charge with the Navigo Easy pass, a card valid from 18 August to 11 September 2024. The pass is given to you when you validate your PVC and must be returned at the end of your stay, at the transport information desks in your hotel or at your point of departure (airports, stations).

6.2.3 OTHER INFORMATION

Problems with your Navigo Easy Pass

If your card malfunctions:

- At the station, go to the nearest ticket office (metro, RER, or certain tram or bus ticket offices): you will be given a replacement voucher valid on the day it is handed in and a temporary pass in your name in exchange for the faulty card. To obtain your new pass, you must present your emergency coupon at the Paris 2024 transport information desk.
- If you are not at the station, you can keep the old Navigo Easy pass and return it to the Paris 2024 transport information desk at the official hotel (PFH) in exchange for a new pass.

In the event of alteration, loss or theft, the Easy pass **will not be replaced** (unless a complaint is lodged with the French police). However, you can purchase a card yourself, either at a station or online at <https://www.iledefrance-mobilites.fr/en/tickets-fares>.

TC (TRANSPORT CONNECT) SERVICE

6.3.1 SERVICE OVERVIEW

The Paris 2024 Transport Connect, known as TC, is a regular shuttle service from strategic points in Greater Paris to competition and non-competition venues, shared with all accredited stakeholders who benefit from the service.

6.3.2 SERVICE OPERATION AND CONDITIONS OF USE

How the TC (for “Transport Connect”) service works.

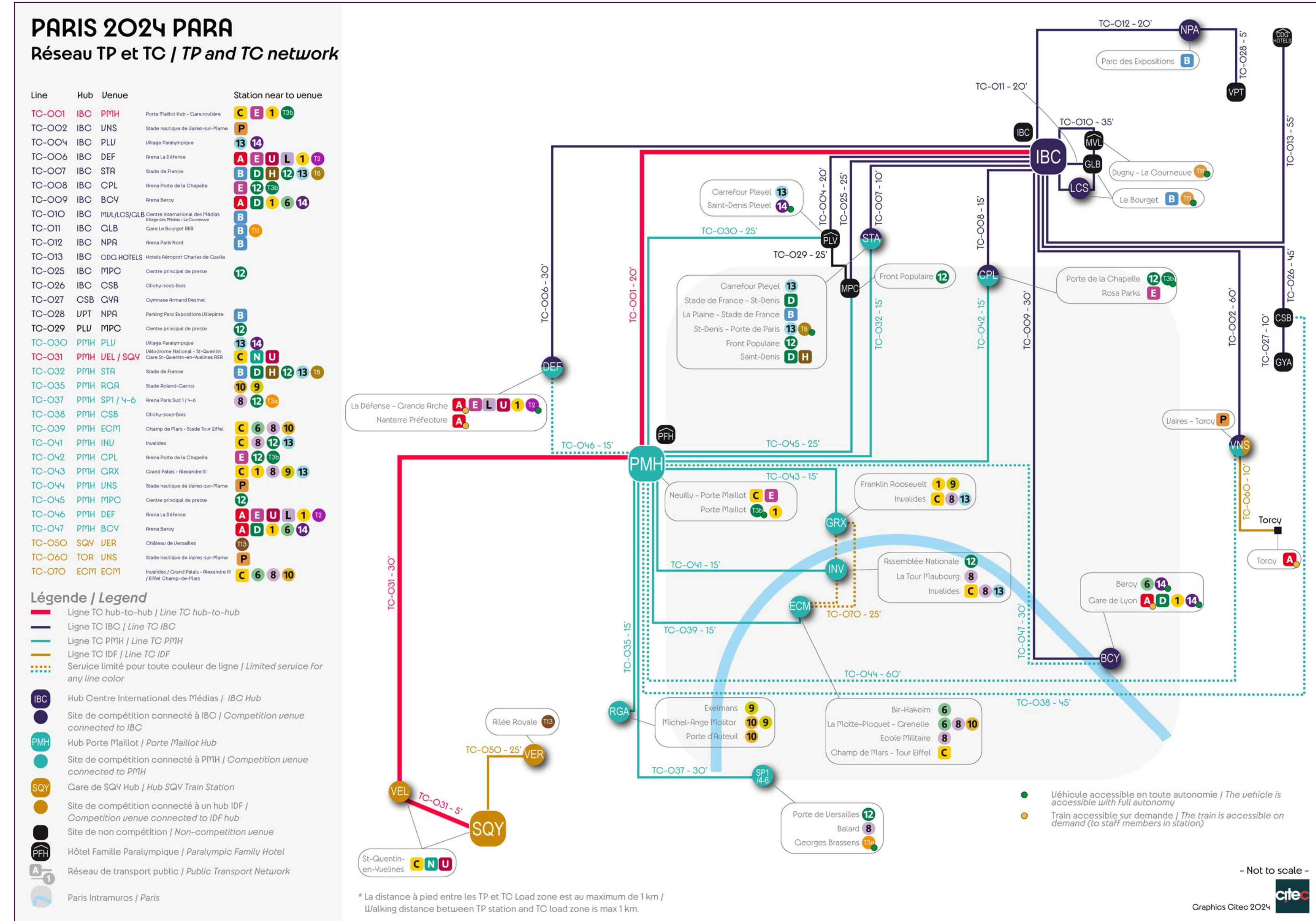
The TC service operates from 3 key locations, called “major hubs”:

- International Broadcast Centre (IBC)
- PMH (Porte Maillot Hub) located in the immediate vicinity of the hotel for the Paralympic Family
- SQY (Saint-Quentin en Yvelines)

These 3 major hubs are also directly connected to each other.

Some public transport lines operate in a special way, particularly in view of the existing public transport network and/or the expected ridership:

- Between PMH and BCY: During the day, the service between PMH and BCY is provided by public transport. There is a frequent night TC service departing from the competition site from the time the metro (line 1) closes until 4 hours after the end of the last session.
- Between PMH and DEF: During the day, the service between PMH and DEF is provided by public transport. There is a frequent night TC service with arrival on site possible 4 hours before the start of the competition until the opening of the metro (line 1), and from the closing of the metro (line 1) to 4 hours after the end of the session.
- Between PMH and VNS: 3 transfers in the morning (arriving at the competition site at H-3.5, H-2.5 and H-1 from the start of the session) and 3 transfers in the afternoon (departing from the competition site at H+1, H+2.5 and H+3.5 after the end of the session).

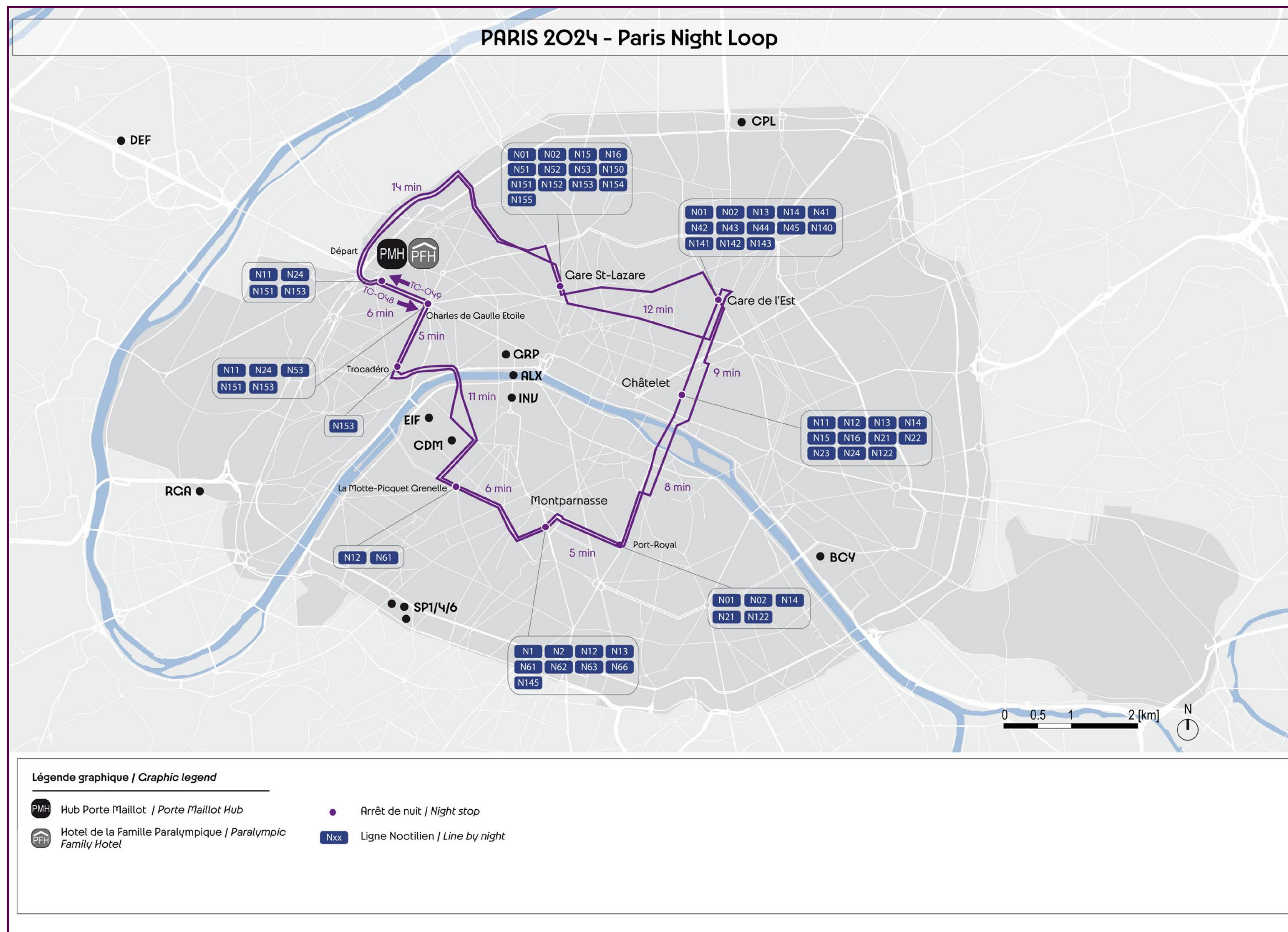

TC Night Loop, travelling by TC at night

The Paris Night Loop provides connections to night-time public transport services as well as access to the hotel. It runs from 29 August to 9 September between 1 am and 6 am, as follows:

FROM 1 AM TO 6 AM: EVERY 20 MIN

Here are the two routes taken by the TC Night Loop:

- ➔ Porte Maillot Hub (PFH) – Charles-de-Gaulle Étoile – Trocadéro – La Motte Piquet Grenelle – Montparnasse – Port Royal – Châtelet – Gare de l'Est – Gare Saint Lazare – Porte Maillot Hub (PFH).
- ➔ Porte Maillot Hub (PFH) – Gare Saint Lazare – Gare de l'Est – Châtelet – Port Royal – Montparnasse – La Motte Piquet Grenelle – Trocadéro – Charles-de-Gaulle Étoile – Porte Maillot Hub (PFH).

Accessibility

The day and night TC service is accessible to people with reduced mobility using low-floor buses. Each bus has a dedicated space for wheelchairs. The coaches also have an integrated elevator and a dedicated space for wheelchairs.

All the platforms for the competition venues and the Porte Maillot Hub are accessible, as are most of those for the IBC.

6.4

TX SERVICES

6.4.1 SERVICE OVERVIEW

The TX system is a fleet of Toyota cars with Paris 2024-accredited volunteer drivers providing one-way transfer services from 18 August to 11 September 2024 between the locations indicated on the list of TX destinations, which can be found in [Appendix 1 - List of official destinations](#) or downloaded from <https://sharing.oodrive.com/share-access/sharings/vkkECEkQ.Jk3qkWkl>.

Passenger pick-up and drop-off areas are located outside the security perimeters of the sites.

The TX service is not available from Paris to Châteauroux and/or from Châteauroux to Paris.

6.4.2 SERVICE OPERATION AND CONDITIONS OF USE

Available to TX accredited persons for journeys within the host and co-host cities, you can access the TX service either with vehicles already available at the exit of competition sessions and certain non-competition venues, or by making a reservation.

The TX therefore gives access to two service categories:

- The “Ready-to-go” service **(TXR)**
- The “Bookable” service **(TXB)**

Multiple TX service users may have to share a TX vehicle (when heading for the same destination) to optimise the service and reduce waiting times.

On the day of the Opening Ceremony TX services will be suspended as of 13h00.

On the day of the Closing Ceremony as of 13h00 TX services will operate from competition venues to accommodation and for departures.

IMPACT OF SPECIAL EVENTS ON TRANSPORT SERVICES

Specific events will affect the routes you take during the Games. Examples include the Torch Relay, ceremonies and road races. These route modifications are integrated into the GPS navigation systems of Paris 2024 transport service drivers, as well as self-drive drivers, in order to reduce the impact on your journey times, which may be altered. Transport information is updated in real time.

Transport services are established and coordinated according to the same timetable so that you can access the competition site and enjoy the events.

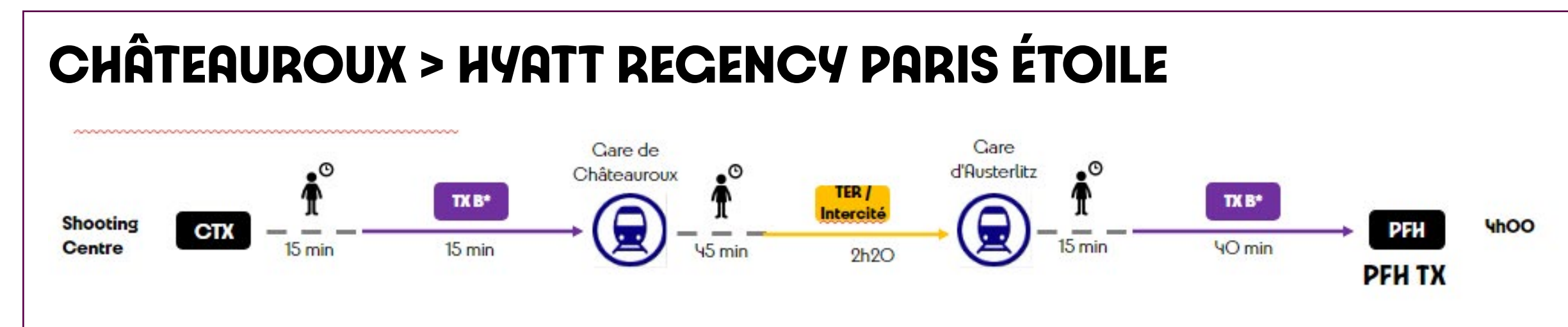
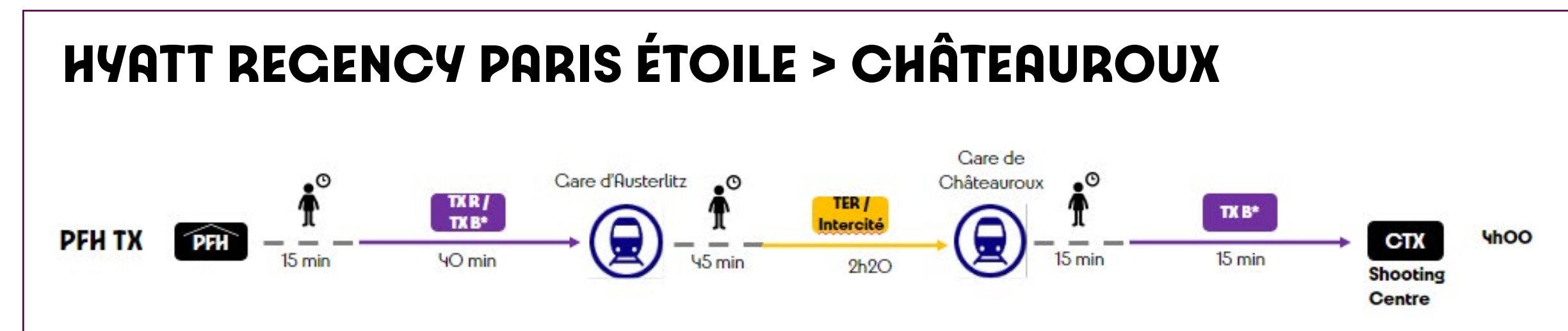

6.6.2 GETTING AROUND ONCE YOU ARRIVE AT CHÂTEAUROUX STATION

These CT shuttle lines between transport hubs and competition venues are also active in Châteauroux, they are designed to complement public transport access. You can travel on TC lines from 3 days before the competition days until one day after they end.

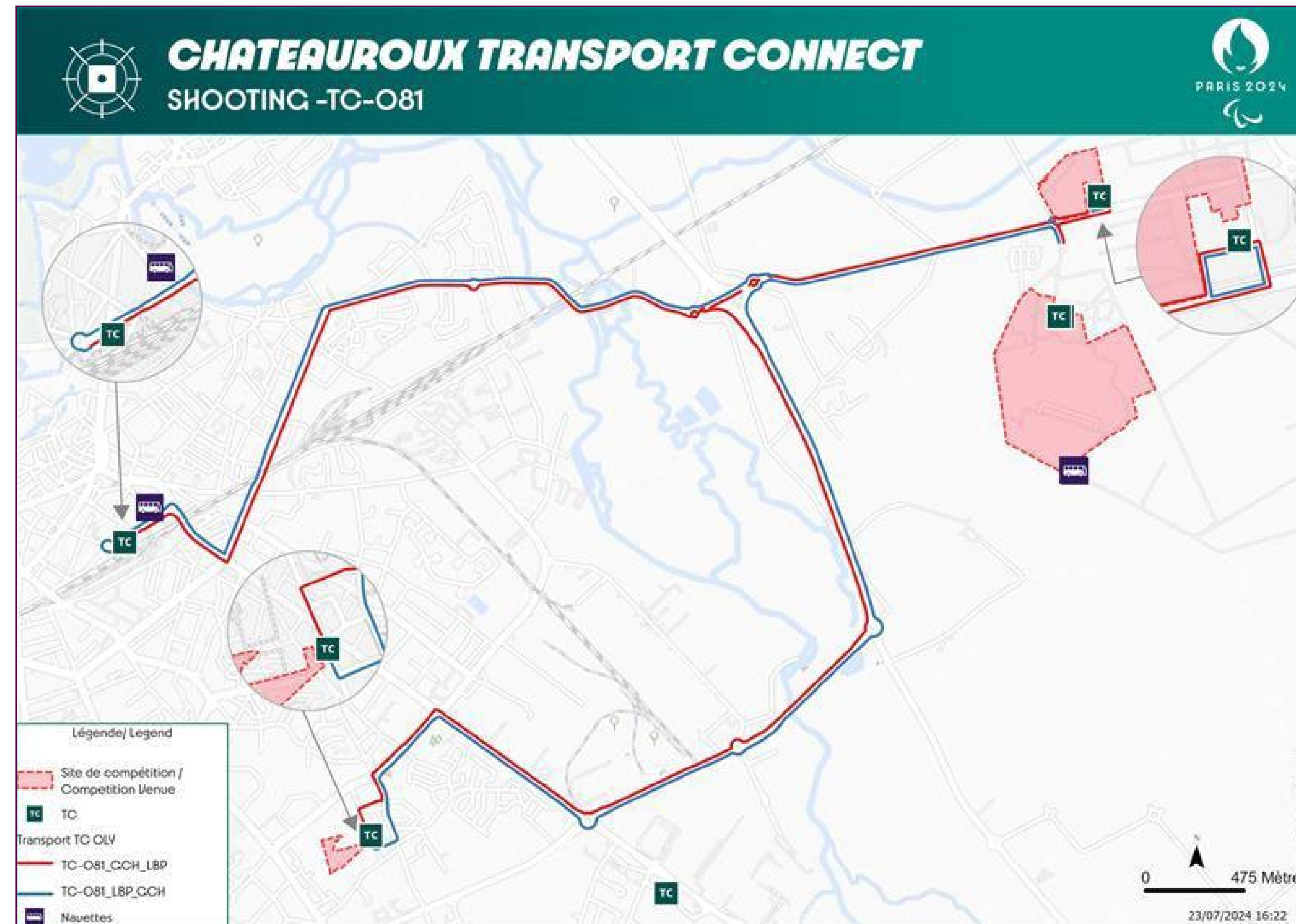

Paris 2024 has proposed to the IPC to reserve trains for the different periods.

The seats and contingency periods are there to provide a service for all mobility-impaired people and wheelchair users, so that a level of service can be maintained if there are no more accessible places on the shuttles organised by Paris 2024. In order to be allocated a seat on pre-booked lines*, you can go to the transport information desk where a volunteer will guide you through the process.

6.7.2 APPLICATION PARIS 2024 TRANSPORT ACCRED



Paris 2024 offers a mobile app dedicated to Games-time transport for accredited guests. We recommend that you download this application before the Games, as soon as you have your accreditation number. Available in 3 languages (French, English and Spanish), it can be downloaded from Google Play and App Store from early July 2024.

This app takes into account the transport privileges to which you are entitled.

This app is essential for:

- Keeping up with all transport information, such as route changes, in real time.
- Calculate and compare the best means of transport to get to the official competition and non-competition venues in the Ile-de-France region - see Appendix 1 for the list of official destinations.
- Identifying accessible routes (Paris 2024 Transport Connect service and public transport) for people with disabilities or booking an adapted vehicle for the TXB.
- View multimodal itineraries for your journeys (public transport, Transport Connect, TX, cycling, walking, etc.).
- Book your TXB (at least 2 hours before the race), mentioning any special needs you may have.

To use this application, you must be connected to the Internet and enter your accreditation number and the password you chose when registering with AccredConnect to log in to your area.

6.7.3 BICYCLES

Personal bikes

You can use your own bike and/or contact the Paris hotels to find out what bicycles they have available. However, Paris 2024 cannot be held responsible for any accident, theft or damage suffered when travelling by bike. Around the official competition venues and major non-competition venues, dedicated free parking zones for accredited persons' bicycles have been set up and are indicated in the Paris 2024 transport app. When you choose to use the bicycle mode of transport, the destination will automatically be that of the bicycle parking facility linked to the chosen site, if such a facility exists.

Please note that bikes must be left outside the venues. Although accredited persons are authorised to bring cycling helmets into the venues, we recommend that you leave your helmet with your bike, locked to it with your bike lock. Electric batteries are also allowed inside the venues, but no lockers are provided for storing them. Cycling helmets and electric batteries are forbidden for spectators and may not be brought into the venue if you are attending a sporting event with a general public ticket.

Self-service public bicycles in Ile-de-France

An alternative way to get around by bike is to use the self-service bikes provided by the city or conurbation authorities.

7.1

COORDINATION OF MEDICAL SERVICES

Paris 2024 has taken out insurance to cover medical expenses for a period corresponding to the pre-opening of the Olympic and Paralympic Village on 12 July 2024 until its closure on 30 September 2024. The expenses covered include medical expenses incurred in mainland France in the event of injury and/or illness, including in the event of illness linked to an epidemic. However, medical expenses relating to chronic or pre-existing illnesses are not covered. In the event of the accidental death of a member of the Paralympic Family, a repatriation procedure is planned and coordinated by the Paris 2024 Medical Operations Centre (i.e. MEDOC), the French authorities and those of the country concerned.

Paris 2024 strongly advises you to take out insurance to cover medical expenses incurred outside the above-mentioned period.

Medical services are organised by the Medical Operations Centre (MEDOC), located within the Main Operations Centre (MOC) at the Paris 2024 headquarters in the Pulse building

MEDICAL SERVICES AT THE OFFICIAL HOTEL

Dedicated medical services are provided at the Hyatt Regency Paris Étoile (PFH) in LAB 15 on the Mezzanine level. You can find all the information about these services in [section 4.3.2 Services](#).

If a hospital transfer is necessary, you will be taken to the designated hospital for the Paralympic Family, the Georges Pompidou European Hospital, whose contact details are given in [section 7.6 Contact details for official hospitals in Ile-de-France](#). In the event of a major emergency, the doctor can call on the state's resuscitation ambulance service (SMUR).

MEDICAL SERVICES AT THE PARALYMPIC VILLAGE PARIS

The polyclinic is intended primarily for athletes and not for the Paralympic Family, who have access to medical services directly from the Paralympic Family Hotel (PFH).



7.4

MEDICAL SERVICES AT COMPETITION VENUES

Spectator medical posts are available for any medical attention required at the competition venues. If a hospital transfer is necessary, you will be taken to the designated hospital for the Paralympic Family, the Georges Pompidou European Hospital, whose contact details are given in [section 7.6 Contact details for official hospitals in Ile-de-France](#). In the event of a major emergency, the doctor can call on the state's resuscitation ambulance service.



7.5

MEDICAL SERVICES AT NON-COMPETITION VENUES

7.5.1 AIRPORTS

Paris 2024's medical services rely on airport medical services at Paris Orly and Paris Charles de Gaulle. In the event of an emergency, coordination between Paris 2024 and the Paris airports' medical services will ensure transfer to a dedicated hospital.

7.5.2 OPENING & CLOSING CEREMONIES

Medical services are provided during the opening and closing ceremonies. Ambulances are available to support interventions if necessary.

7.5.3 AT THE MAIN PRESS CENTRE (MPC)

The MPC is located in the Pulse building, which also houses the MEDOC, where the presence of doctors and the SIAP (fire safety and personal assistance service) is guaranteed for the duration of the Paralympic Games.

7.5.4 INTERNATIONAL BROADCAST CENTRE (IBC)

Throughout the period from 23 August to 11 September, the international radio and television centre will be equipped with round-the-clock medical care to enable journalists to cover the event.

Please note that from 12 to 22 August, medical care is only available during the day (9 am to 5 pm).

MEDICAL SERVICES IN CHÂTEAUROUX

At the Châteauroux Paralympic Village, daytime care is provided by a physiotherapist and an osteopath between 8 am and 10 pm. At night, in case of emergency, an on-call service is provided by an emergency doctor, available on call at following number +33 (0) 6 89 25 45 11.

If medical services are required during the day, you can go to the medical post on the competition site near the Paralympic Village. The medical team includes the following specialists:

- 1 sports doctor
- 1 emergency doctor
- 1 nurse
- 1 physiotherapist
- 6 people trained in first-aid and 1 ambulance

If you have a specific need, for example to book a non-emergency medical appointment, you can contact the medical posts directly at the competition venue. You will be put in touch with a Zonal Medical Coordinator, a local doctor who can help you find an appointment.

In the event of an emergency, care will be provided by government services, with the SAMU regulation number to call being 15 from French numbers or 112 from foreign numbers. Paris 2024's medical services have an agreement with the Centre Hospitalier Châteauroux, located at 216 avenue de Verdun, 36 000 Châteauroux. It will admit you after regulation, either by the Paris 2024 Zonal Medical Coordinator, or after calling the SAMU Center - by dialing 15 or 112.

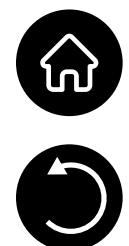

8.2.1 GENERAL OVERVIEW OF PARALYMPIC COMPETITION VENUES

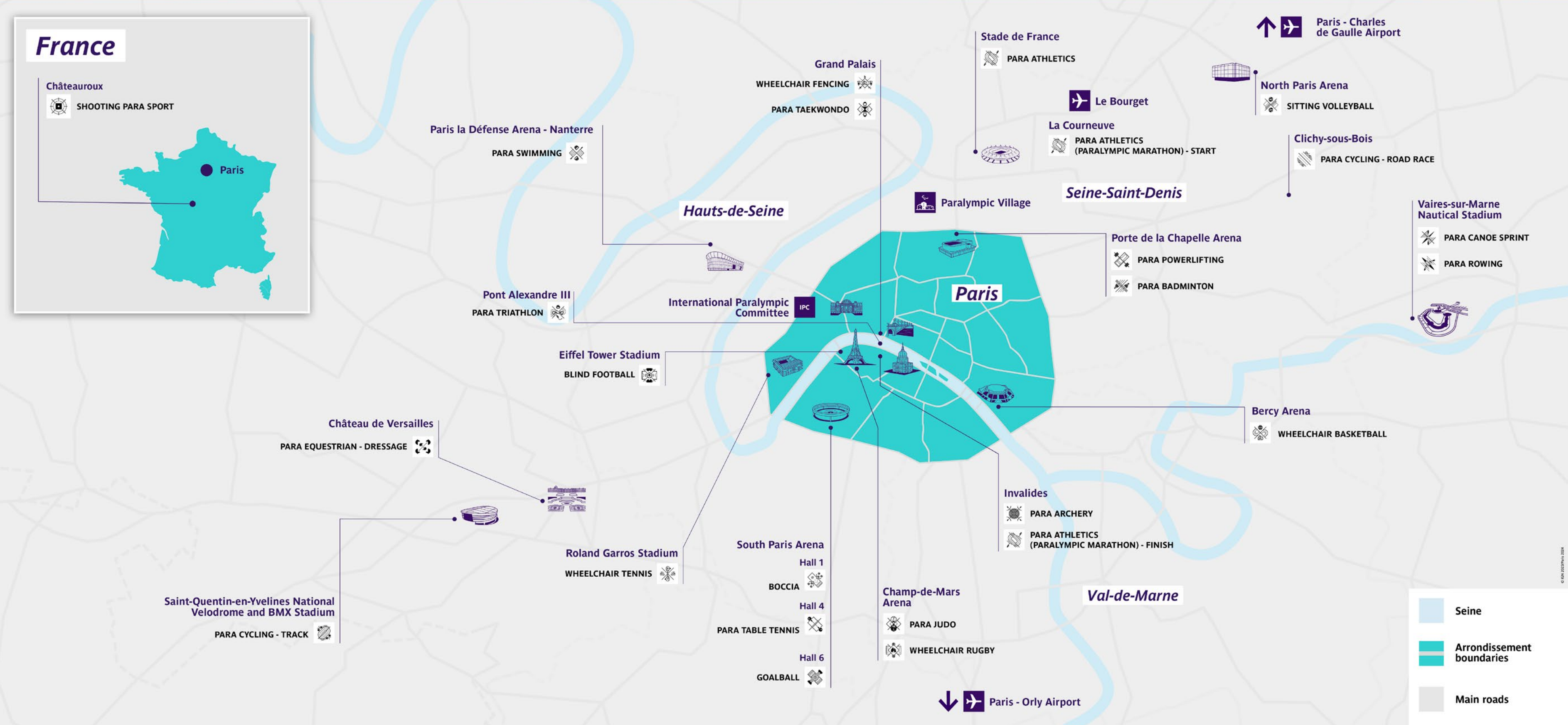

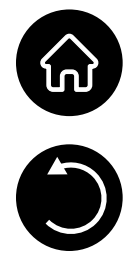

- All competition venues are served by public transport or authorised transport (TC-TX for the Paralympic Family).
- All competition venues accessible to people with reduced mobility

8.2.3 OFFICIAL COMPETITION VENUES

The Paralympic Family lounges

The Paralympic Family lounges are dedicated spaces available at each competition venue, offering hospitality and catering services. They are accessible to all holders of a "6" indicated on their accreditation or, where applicable, an "upgrade card zone 6".

These lounges are open during the competition period, which is specific to each venue, at the following times:

- Opening: one hour before the start of the competition.
- Closing: one hour after the end of the competition or victory ceremony (30 minutes after when the competition/victory ceremony ends after 9 pm).

The following service levels are available:

- TV screens broadcast the Paralympic events and free Wi-Fi is available. Tables and chairs are available, as well as a relaxation area with sofas and armchairs.
- Light meals in the form of cold buffets will be available according to the competition timetable at each venue. Snacks and non-alcoholic Coca Cola drinks (RGB format) are available continuously throughout the sports sessions.
- In each lounge, you'll find a welcome desk to answer your questions about transport, the running of competitions and, more generally, the layout of the site.

The Paralympic Family stands

Your stands, accessible on a first-come, first-served basis, are exclusively reserved for you and are divided into two sections, identified by coloured covers affixed directly to the seats:

- Paralympic Family Stand, "O", gold covers
- Federation Stand, "F", pink covers

Depending on the privileges indicated on your accreditation card – either "O" or "F" – the Paris 2024 teams will indicate your seat.

Like the lounges, the stands also open one hour before the start of events, and close one hour after the end. This time limit is reduced to 30 minutes if the events finish after 9 pm.

Depending on the nature of certain sporting disciplines, the Paralympic Family will have access to standing room in a dedicated area as close as possible to the field of play. This is the case for para road cycling, para marathon, para triathlon and para slalom canoeing. Dedicated wheelchair spaces are available within the zones, on a first-come, first-served basis.

It is important to note that at some competition venues, there is a long walking distance between the drop-off zone and the grandstands and/or the Paralympic Family lounge. However, the Venue Protocol team can provide a Toyota accessible people mover (APM). These venues include Clichy-sous-Bois, Eiffel Champs-de-Mars, Versailles, and the Vélodrome de Saint-Quentin-en-Yvelines.

Paris 2024 tickets

If you have purchased tickets for the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games, you can now collect your tickets directly from the "Paris 2024 Tickets" application presented in section [11.20. Useful applications for Smartphone](#). This is the only way to access your tickets, and only presentation of the ticket from the app will be accepted at access control on D-Day. As the event approaches, a secure QR code will appear on your ticket in the app, allowing you to access the competition site.

PARALYMPIC
VILLAGES

The location of the Paralympic Village reflects Paris 2024's ambition to deliver a more responsible and spectacular Games with a strong legacy. It is part of the urban development plan by the Seine-Saint-Denis authorities, and brings together new permanent infrastructure, built with the most efficient and low carbon technology, some temporary infrastructure, as well as existing historic buildings.

There is also a Satellite Village close to the Châteauroux competition venue, for shooting para sport teams. Separate accommodation has also been set up in Versailles for the grooms (para-riders).

Overall, the Paralympic Villages are designed to integrate seamlessly into the two cities and provide easy access to the competition venues. They have been designed to be more responsible and environmentally friendly, with facilities to ensure the comfort of athletes and team officials during the Games.



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8.3.1 PARIS PARALYMPIC VILLAGE

Address: 32 Quai de Saint-Ouen, 93200 Saint-Denis

Opening period: August 21, 2024 to September 10, 2024

Opening hours: 24/7

A compact site covering 52 hectares, the Paralympic Village is located across three towns in the Seine-Saint-Denis region (Saint-Denis, Saint-Ouen and Île-Saint-Denis), close to Paris and the banks of the Seine. Designed to meet the needs of the delegations, the Paralympic Village offers a truly Parisian experience in a comfortable and secure environment on the banks of the Seine.

You can access the village if your accreditation has the "PLV" venue entitlement, and you can access the residential zone if you have zone "R" entitlement. A pass system allows CNP visitors, friends and family of delegations and dignitaries access to the Paralympic Village. Each CNP delegation is allocated a daily quota of guest passes to the Paralympic Village. Requests for guest passes must be addressed to the Chef de Mission of the NPC concerned or to the intermediary of the IPC before they can be entered in the online guest pass portal (GUP) no later than 12 noon on the day before the visit. After 12 pm, the system will refuse all requests for the following day.

The following services are offered in the village square every day between 9 am and 9 pm. They will be accessible to residents, as well as to people visiting the Paralympic Village with a guest pass: Athletes' lounge managed by Samsung, cash machine, bureau de change, supermarket, hairdresser's (free for athletes), shop selling official Paris 2024 products, post office, café, florist and tourist and cultural information office for Paris and the surrounding region. Services are not free of charge unless specified.

The Trêve fresco and a replica of an athlete's bedroom are also on display in the Place du Village.

8.3.2 PARALYMPIC VILLAGE CHÂTEAUROUX

Address: 2 Chemin de Beaumont, 36130 Déols

Opening period: From August 21, 2024 at 8 am to September 7, 2024 at 6 pm

Opening hours: 24/7

The Paralympic Village in Châteauroux welcomes athletes and team officials from the shooting sports. The Village has a dedicated security area and is located at the PESI (Pôle d'Enseignement Supérieur International) which stands 500 meters from the competition venue.

8.4

INTERNATIONAL BROADCAST CENTRE (IBC)

8.4.1 GENERAL INFORMATION

The International Broadcast Centre (IBC) provides accredited rights-holding media with services and facilities. The IBC is home to the Paralympic Broadcast Centre, the Production Centre and the Olympic Broadcast Services (OBS).

Located in the Paris Le Bourget Exhibition Centre, the IBC comprises 5 exhibition halls with a total surface area of 80,000 m², plus 250,000 m² of outdoor space. The complex also offers services such as a media bus station, information and assistance desks, stores and restaurants. From August 28 to September 8, a shuttle service for the media runs between the IBC and competition sites, accommodation venues, etc.

MAIN PRESS CENTRE (MPC)

The Main Press Centre (MPC) at the Paris 2024 headquarters, called Pulse, serves as a workspace for the 2,300 international journalists accredited to cover the event. This includes print and web media, photographers and non-rights-holding broadcasters. Accredited members of the press are invited to use the many services offered within the MPC: the dedicated press and photo room, interview rooms, catering facilities, relaxation areas and private offices for a number of international agencies and national Paralympic committees.

The press conference room will enable the world's media to find out the latest news from the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games and interact directly with athletes, referees or coaches.

8.5.1 MPC GUEST PASS OFFICE

The MPC Guest Pass Office is located next to the entrance at Pulse. Passes are designed to meet the needs of non-accredited visitors to the Main Press Centre. They are not a substitute for permanent accreditation. Non-transferable, they are valid only on the day they are issued, and only authorise access to the MPC.

Pass requests can be sent by email to mpcguestpass@paris2024.org or made in person at the Guest Pass Office. They must be submitted by 10:00 am on the day before the scheduled visit. Pass applicants must be sponsored by a MPC-accredited person.

Guests must collect their pass in person by presenting a valid identity card or passport.

8.6

PROHIBITED, RESTRICTED AND AUTHORISED ITEMS ON THE VARIOUS SITES

There are three categories of object in site access management:

- **Prohibited objects:** objects which are strictly forbidden on Paris 2024 sites;
- **Restricted items:** items which are authorised on the sites, but restricted in quantity and/or type;
- **Objects considered to be "Work tools":** objects which are authorised on the sites only if they are necessary for the proper conduct of the professional activities of identified populations

OPENING CEREMONY - WEDNESDAY 28 AUGUST 2024 - 8 PM TO 11:15 PM

9.1.1 AN OUT-OF-THE-ORDINARY CONCEPT

The Opening Ceremony of the Paralympic Games will take place on 28 August 2024, and for the first time in the history of the Paralympic Games, it will be held outside a stadium, in the heart of the city. From the Champs-Élysées to the Place de la Concorde, the ceremony was designed to highlight not only the city of Paris, but also the Paralympic athletes and the values they embody. An unprecedented celebration in an exceptional setting in the heart of Paris!

Central Paris will be heavily affected by the Opening Ceremony, and the government has imposed a number of restrictions to ensure event safety.

A special Opening Ceremony VAPP (Vehicle Access Point and Parking Permit) is required to access these areas as of 1 pm.

A list of prohibited items has been drawn up by the government to ensure everyone's safety during the evening. It is detailed in the CEREMONY KIT, which will be sent to you before the event with all the information you need to ensure your evening goes smoothly.

9.1.2 ACCESS TO THE CEREMONY SITE AND THE PARALYMPIC FAMILY AREAS

The Paralympic Family will be present in several stands on the Place de la Concorde.

An informative document will be sent to you in the run-up to the Paralympic Games containing information about your place and the access pass to use or collect beforehand to make your arrival at the venue easier. This information will be communicated to you by your Responsible Organisation.

Getting to Place de la Concorde

There are two different ways of accessing the ceremony site, depending on the location you have been allocated.

More information to come about the valid pass for each guest at the ceremony.

1. ACCESS WITH ACCREDITATION AND "OC" STICKER

Members of the Paralympic Family with "complimentary" access to the Opening Ceremony will only be granted access with accreditation and an "OC" sticker, which is valid only on this day and must be affixed to the accreditation.

Only those holding these 2 items may access the La Concorde site.

In addition to these two items, you will also have a CEREMONY PASS which will give you access to your dedicated areas and grandstands on the Ceremony site. This CEREMONY PASSPASS is an additional accreditation dedicated solely to Ceremonies. It can only be used once. If you take part in the Closing Ceremony, you will receive another CEREMONY PASS as it approaches.

THE CEREMONY KIT

The CEREMONY KIT is a set of specific items for the evening ceremonies. Each CEREMONY KIT includes:

- An **"OC" sticker** to affix to your accreditation for access to the La Concorde site.
- A **CEREMONY PASS** to access the different areas and stands dedicated to the Paralympic Family
- A **MEAL COUPON** for members of the Paralympic Family to exchange for a packed lunch.
- A **TRANSPORT PLAN** detailing your itinerary: meeting time and place, method of transport to and from the meeting point, etc.

The CEREMONY KIT is to be picked up as the ceremony approaches by your contact person.

More information about the date, time and place of collection of this CEREMONY KIT will be communicated to your contact person closer to the ceremony.

2. ACCESS WITH A DIGITAL TICKET

For members of the Paralympic Family with a paying ticket, access is via a digital ticket. Accreditation is not required for access to these stands.

The people in charge of each of your organisations who have access to the CTP (Client Ticketing Portal) are responsible for sending you your digital tickets (complimentary and paying), ordered at the end of 2023. The Paris 2024 Tickets application is required to access your ticket. No tickets will be printed.

More information on how to use the CTP can be found in the user guide, which can be downloaded from the platform. If they have any questions, they can contact their key account manager.

As well as information about your position in the stand (block, row, seat number), this digital ticket also tells you which metro station is closest to your stand so that you can get there easily using public transport.

9.1.3 TRANSPORT SERVICES ON THE DAY OF THE PARALYMPIC GAMES OPENING CEREMONY

The Opening Ceremony is a special day that requires all the transport services offered to accredited guests to be modified.

In order to facilitate operations, all Paris 2024 transport services offered in normal time (public transport, TXR, TXB, dedicated vehicles, etc.) will be suspended from 1 pm on 28 August 2024.

In your personal transport plan, which you will receive when the CEREMONY KIT is distributed, you will find the transport service to use to get to Place de la Concorde.

As there is a large security perimeter for such a ceremony in the city, no taxis or private cars will be allowed access to the ceremony site. We therefore advise you to follow the information on your personal transport plan.

To access the various transport services and personal accreditation, the sticker and the CEREMONY PASS will be checked.

DEPARTURE BY BUS FROM THE HYATT REGENCY PARIS ÉTOILE (PFH) HOTEL

For members of the Paralympic Family entitled to transportation services for the Opening Ceremony, shuttle buses will depart from the Hyatt Regency Paris Étoile (PFH) hotel. These shuttles will take you to Rue de Rivoli, just a few metres from Place de la Concorde. Accessible transport service will also be available for Paralympic Family members. An accessible transportation service will also be available for members of the Paralympic Family.

At the end of the Ceremony, the route is the same, with buses to take you to the PFH.

DEPARTURE BY PUBLIC TRANSPORT FROM THE PARALYMPIC FAMILY HOTEL OR ANOTHER HOTEL

If you are travelling to the Concorde site by your own means, the only accepted point of entry to the celebration site is via rue Royale. The nearest metro station is "Madeleine", 350 m from the entrance to the Concorde site. This station is wheelchair accessible. This station is served by line 12 and line 14 (direct access from the village).

As the Place de la Concorde is cut in two, it will not be possible to enter the site from any other access point.

As the ceremony takes place in the heart of the city, public transport is the preferred means of getting to the ceremony site.

Important information

→ There will be no direct access to the Opening Ceremony site from or to the Concorde venue.

CLOSING CEREMONY - SUNDAY 8 SEPTEMBER 2024 - 8:30 PM TO 11 PM

9.2.1 CONCEPT

The Closing Ceremony of the Paralympic Games takes place on the evening of September 8 at the Stade de France. A symbolic venue for French sport and the Paris 2024 Games.

Located in Saint-Denis, close to the Village, it welcomes all the athletes one last time to parade in the final sequence of the Paralympic Games.

A spectacular artistic show and ceremonial sequences will set the rhythm for the evening.

9.2.2 ACCESS TO THE CEREMONY SITE AND THE PARALYMPIC FAMILY AREAS

An informative document will be sent to you in the run-up to the Paralympic Games containing information about your place and the access pass to use or collect beforehand to make your arrival at the venue easier. This information will be communicated to you by your contact person.

Access with the CEREMONY KIT (accreditation required)

To use the CEREMONY KIT, present your personal accreditation at the entrance to the Stade de France, together with the "CC" sticker, a dedicated sticker for the Closing Ceremony.

As with the Opening Ceremony, the CEREMONY PASS for the Closing Ceremony gives you access to your areas and stands.

The CEREMONY KIT is to be picked up as the ceremony approaches by your contact person.

As a reminder, a CEREMONY KIT has been put together for the Closing Ceremony of the Paralympic Games:

- A "CC" sticker to attach to your accreditation for access to the Stade de France site
- A CEREMONY PASS to access the different areas and stands dedicated to the Paralympic Family
- A MEAL VOUCHER for members of the Paralympic Family with access to the concessions, to be exchanged for a packed lunch.
- A TRANSPORT PLAN detailing your itinerary: meeting time and place, method of transport to and from the meeting point, etc.

More information about the date, time and place of collection of this CEREMONY KIT will be communicated to your contact person closer to the ceremony.

Access with a digital ticket (accreditation not required)

As with the Opening Ceremony, members of the Paralympic Family with paid tickets will be able to access the Ceremony site with a digital ticket, which they can collect using the "Paris 2024 - Tickets" application.

The distribution process for these tickets by the inviting entities is identical to that for the Opening Ceremony, via the managers in your organisation who have access to the CTP.

More information on how to use the CTP can be found in the user guide, which can be downloaded from the platform. If they have any questions, they can contact their key account manager.

This digital ticket, as well as giving you information about your place in the grandstand (block, row, seat number), also tells you which metro station is closest to your front door, so that you can use public transport to get there more easily.

9.2.3 TRANSPORT SERVICES ON THE DAY OF THE PARALYMPIC GAMES CLOSING CEREMONY

8 September is a special day, requiring all the transport services offered to accredited members to be adapted.

On the day of the Closing Ceremony (8 September 2024), Tx services (TXR and TXB) will be modified from 1 pm in the direction of the Stade de France:

- TX remains available in limited numbers to and from competition venues that are still active, as well as for departures and to hotels. No TX can access the Stade de France after 1 pm.
- The TXB will be suspended except for journeys to stations and airports.

To get to the Stade de France, a dedicated transport plan has been put in place for all members of the Paralympic Family who need to get to the Ceremony site.

In your personal transport plan, included in the CEREMONY KIT, you will find the transport service to use to get to the Stade de France.

As the security perimeter is very tightly controlled, no taxis or private cars will be allowed onto the Ceremony site. We therefore advise you to follow

the information on your personal transport plan, which will be distributed to you.

Please also note that there will be no direct transport from the Stade de France to airports or stations on this day.

Operating the transport service for the Closing Ceremony

→ **You will leave the Hyatt Regency Paris Etoile (PFH) Hotel to go to the Stade de France by bus:** for the outward journey, coaches will take you to the area around the stadium, with a drop-off point on Avenue du Président Wilson, the avenue next to the stadium, a few dozen metres from the gates through which you will enter the stadium.

For the return journey, buses will take you from avenue du Président Wilson to your hotel.

- **If you are travelling to the Stade de France by public transport,** the nearest metro or RER stations are:
 - RER B: La Plaine Stade de France then 9 min walk to the stadium
 - RER D: Stade de France - Saint Denis then 15 min walk to the stadium
 - Metro line 13: Saint Denis - Porte de Paris station then 6 min walk to the stadium
 - Metro line 12: Front Populaire station then 25 min walk to the stadium

Last but not least, for participants staying at various competition venues on the same day, the timetable allows everyone to go directly to the Stade de France using public transport, or to return to the Hyatt Regency Paris Etoile (PFH) to pick up buses for guests using this service. No buses leave the competition venues to go directly to the Stade de France.

More information to come about transportation for each guest at the ceremony and about open and closed metro stations nearby.

WHEELCHAIR, ORTHOTIC AND PROSTHETIC REPAIR SERVICES

11

Ottobock will be the official provider of wheelchair and prosthetic/orthotic repair services for athletes, NPC team officials, International Federation Games officials and members of the Paralympic Family during the Paralympic Games.

Repairs will be made free of charge to wheelchairs, orthoses or prostheses which, if not repaired, would prevent athletes from competing or delegates from retaining their usual degree of independence.

The main workshop is located in the Paralympic village in the B2T Residential zone. Dates and operation times are shown in the table below:

VISION OF PARIS 2024

Paris 2024 places sport at the heart of its ambition. Through the emotions it inspires, sport is an incomparable way to bring people together and build cohesion. Through its values, sport is a powerful tool for education and integration.

Aware of the unique opportunity that the Olympic and Paralympic Games represent, Paris 2024 hopes that the enthusiasm and energy of this project will reveal the power of sport and its values, and unite as many people as possible in order to bring more sport into everyone's daily life.

This ambition is supported by a new organisational model, for an innovative Games that will be both spectacular and more responsible. A spectacular Games that will make a lasting impression, taking sport to places where it's not expected, in a celebration at the heart of the cities, and building bridges with culture and education. A sustainable Games, to inspire future generations:

- A **demanding approach**, to put the energy of the Games at the service of a useful project and to achieve tangible results; but also a demand for exemplary ethical, financial, social and environmental performance;
- **Creativity**, to reject pre-established models by innovating and daring to do things differently;
- **Sharing**, so that this project can benefit as many people as possible, across all generations and in all regions; sharing, so that this ambition can spread and be carried beyond 2024.

11.1.1 SLOGAN

Games Wide Open

This slogan is an invitation to the whole world to come and experience new emotions, together. Our Games promise unprecedented experiences and sensations, particularly during the competitions outside the stadiums in the heart of Paris, and the exceptional opening ceremony on the Place de la Concorde.



11.1.2 EMBLEM

An iconic emblem

The Paris 2024 Emblem combines three symbolic elements that make up the face of the Paris 2024 Games: the medal, the flame and a Marianne – a symbolic figure representing the French Republic and its values, as expressed by its motto: “Liberté, Égalité, Fraternité” (“Liberty, Equality, Fraternity”).



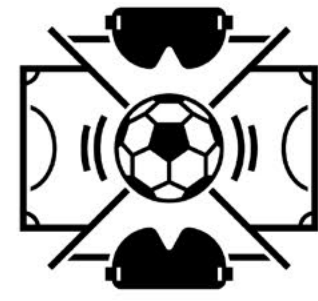
11.1.3 SPORTS PICTOGRAMS

Pictograms turned coats of arms

Paris 2024 has reinvented the sports pictogram, turning it into a coat of arms behind which a sporting family can rally. What they have in common: values, a discipline, a shared passion and a sense of pride in belonging. Each coat of arms is made up of three graphic components: an axis of symmetry, a representation of the playing field or practice area, and an item of equipment used in the sport it represents. The common denominator is an elegant and impactful design combining sobriety and efficiency.

A total of 62 pictograms representing the Paralympic and Olympic disciplines have been created: 15 Olympic, 39 Paralympic, and 8 common to both Games.

11.1.4 MEDALS

A symbol of excellence, a source of self-transcendence and the ultimate reward, medals are the ultimate accolade for top-level athletes.

As part of the LVMH group's partnership with Paris 2024, Chaumet, founded in 1780 and a jeweller renowned the world over for their French craftsmanship and the elegance of its creations, has designed this medal. This creative journey began at the 1924 Paris Games. A century has passed since then and time has polished the symbols of the City of Light to make it shine even brighter in 2024. This medal represents not only the radiance of the athletes' achievements, but also the brilliance of the French crafts and their expertise. At its heart: a piece of original iron from the Eiffel Tower, in the shape of a hexagon - the symbol of France - set like a precious stone, reflects prowess from another time. The athletes will be taking a piece of both French history and Paris's most emblematic landmark home with them.

Erected for the 1889 Universal Exhibition, the Eiffel Tower is made entirely of "puddled iron". Made in the forges and blast furnaces of Pompey, Lorraine, the cast iron produced by reducing iron ore is refined by an operation known as "puddling". With all excess carbon removed, the resulting iron is almost pure and extremely robust.

Over the course of the 20th century, the structure of the Eiffel Tower underwent several renovation campaigns. Some of the metal elements have been permanently removed and carefully preserved by the Société d'Exploitation de la Tour Eiffel (SETE). These true pieces of history are given a second wind of glory here, magnified by the values of the Paralympic Spirit.

11.1.5 MASCOTS

Revolutionary mascots

The Games mascots usually take the form of an animal associated with the host country.

The mascots of Paris 2024, les Phryges, have broken free from this tradition and personify an ideal, a powerful symbol of freedom and a historical reference known to all French people: the Phrygian cap.

Les Phryges are two Phrygian caps leading the revolution through sport. A Paralympic mascot and an Olympic mascot, each with its own personality, to get everyone in France and around the world on board for the adventure of the Paris 2024 Games.

The Paralympic Phryge

Full of life, spontaneous, a bit of a hothead, she's not afraid of anything, she wants it all! Always up for new experiences, she's a total extrovert and rallies everyone around her with her energy and enthusiasm! Her dynamism is contagious.



The Olympic Phryge

A fine tactician, she's the smart one of the bunch. A true mathematician, she never rushes into anything without thinking it all through. Careful, methodical, a little crafty, she's a real charmer who also has a sensitive side, although she tries to hide it.



11.1.6 THE PARIS 2024 TORCH

An iconic object of the Games, the Torch of the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games is distinguishable primarily by its colour, which is both unique and radiant. To reflect the forthcoming Games, its designer Mathieu Lehanneur drew inspiration from three themes of Paris 2024: Equality, Water and Peacefulness.

11.1.7 PODIUMS

The podium is the ultimate symbol of performance and its celebration. For Paralympic athletes, reaching the podium is the ultimate achievement. It's the culmination of a long journey, the ultimate recognition of their sporting achievement and a moment that will live forever in their memories. By partnering with Paris 2024 in the manufacture of podiums, Procter & Gamble is reiterating its commitment to supporting the performance and preparation of athletes for these Games. Paris 2024 wanted to create continuity between the medal and the podium, the two symbols of performance that make up the identity of the Games and the pride of the host country. The design of the Paralympic podiums is directly inspired by the metallic lace of the Eiffel Tower, which is also found in the bridges inspired by the work of Gustave Eiffel.



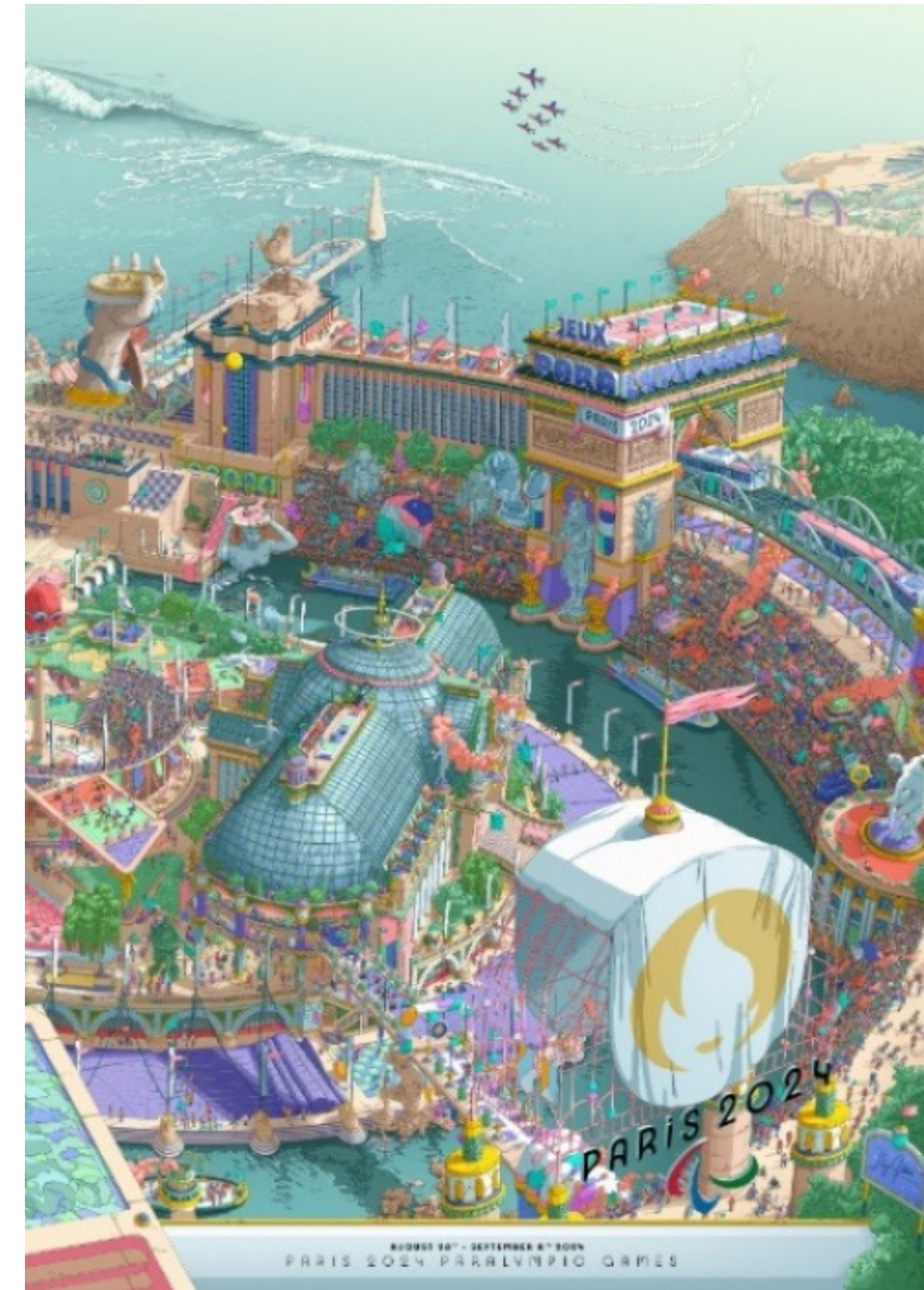
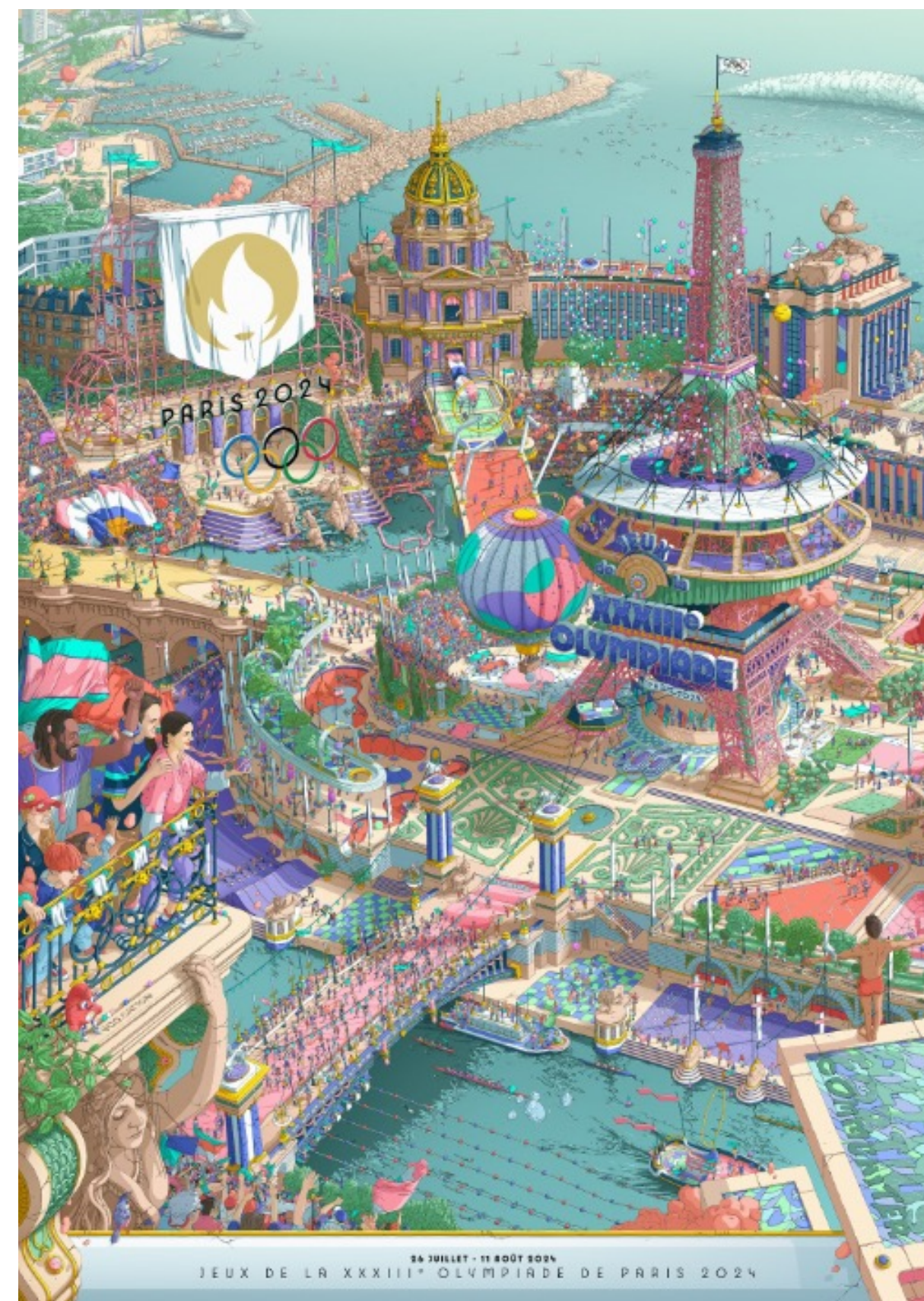
The grey surface of the podium refers to the zinc on the famous Parisian roofs, a symbolic way of taking the medallists up into the Parisian sky. The choice of sober colours (grey and off-white) and a refined design reflects the desire to make the podium blend in with the colourful and fun Look of the Games, as well as with the colours of the official outfits of each delegation.

The podium's modular, built-in design means it can be adapted to different configurations (individual or team Paralympic/Olympic events) and limits the number of podiums to be produced - 68 podiums in total.

11.1.8 OFFICIAL POSTERS

The Official Posters for Paris 2024 depict a stadium-city echoing the slogan “Games Wide Open”, combining monuments, sports, and characters, and reflecting the ambition to “bring sport into the city”. Designed as a diptych, they combine Olympism and the Paralympic spirit, forming a colourful and abundant fresco, unique to the history of the Games.

11.1.9 TYPOGRAPHY

Powerful, refined and resolutely French, the Paris 2024 typeface borrows its elegance from the Art Deco style and its energy from that of sport. Sometimes powerful, sometimes delicate, minimal and pure, this encounter combines fluidity and solidity, bringing together our cultural heritage and sporting performance in a way that has never been done before. Between the art deco nod to the Roaring Twenties and the references to the contemporary digital world, she doesn't choose, she adds.

11.1.10 THE LOOK OF THE GAMES

The Look of the Games is the visual identity of the Olympic and Paralympic Games. This is how competition venues, town centres and celebration areas are decorated for several weeks. This is a means of celebration and a way of spreading emotions that have a global impact. Every four years, the Olympic and Paralympic Games sport a new look, reflecting the culture of the host country and the spirit that the Games wish to reflect.

At the heart of the visual concept of the Paris 2024 Look is a strong ambition: to invite people to celebrate, to celebrate sport and to promote what makes Paris, France and the Games so outstanding. Colourful and aesthetic, bold and pure, modern and rich in symbolism, the Paris 2024 Look reflects the French spirit and the soul of this edition.

During summer 2024, it will be the inseparable backdrop to the finest sporting performances and the greatest moments of shared emotion; it will be anchored in the collective memory of more than 4 billion television viewers and will blend harmoniously into the most magical of settings: the streets of the City of Light and those of the French territories.

IMPACT, LEGACY AND SUSTAINABILITY OF THE PARIS 2024 GAMES

11.2.1 IMPACT & LEGACY STRATEGY

The aim of Paris 2024's Impact & Legacy strategy is for the Games to generate positive impacts for everyone, in France and internationally. This strategy is based on 3 main objectives:

- Optimising economic, social and territorial opportunities by delivering more responsible, relevant Games that open up opportunities for all. In fact, 75% of Paris 2024's suppliers are SMEs. - Combating sedentary lifestyles by promoting daily physical activity. France has adopted a national policy for 30 minutes of daily physical activity in primary schools, a measure initiated by Paris 2024. More than 35,000 sports kits have been distributed to schools with the financial support of the State in June 2024 and the National Sports Agency. 94% of teachers believe that the scheme improves pupils' wellbeing. - Supporting the social impact of sport. Through its Endowment Fund, Paris 2024 supports organisations that use sport as a tool for social impact. In total, more than 1,100 projects have been funded, with almost €50 million distributed and more than 5 million direct beneficiaries. The Games also enabled an unprecedented acceleration in accessibility measures within the City of Paris. A total of 125 million euros has been earmarked for accessibility over the 2020-2026 term. Through the "Olympic Transformations" programme, the City of Paris aims to make the Games a unique opportunity to make the city more accessible, and to leave a significant legacy in this respect. This commitment to heritage can be broken down into three main areas:

- Improving the city's accessibility, in particular by setting up "exemplary zones" of enhanced accessibility, enabling anyone, whatever their situation (families with pushchairs, the elderly, people with disabilities, etc.), to get around Paris easily and to access municipal services within a so-called "15 minute" perimeter. The aim of the project is for one district in each arrondissement (17 in total in Paris) to benefit from the "enhanced accessibility" approach for its public spaces, public services and essential private services.

- Facilitating regular sports practice by significantly increasing the proportion of para-sports clubs in Paris. This improved offer is made possible in particular by additional local practice areas dedicated to parasport, with the help of adapted physical activity rooms in voluntary social and medico-social establishments, or by making school sports facilities available outside school hours. This scheme is behind the 3,000 inclusive sports clubs program, which aims to train 3,000 sports clubs throughout France to welcome disabled participants by 2024.
- Improving the participation of people with disabilities in the life of the city, with the creation of new inclusive and innovative living environments allowing full access to goods and services, such as the Résidence Accessibilité, located in the 20th arrondissement of Paris.

11.2.2 ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY OF PARIS 2024

Organising Better Games with less and that leave a legacy

Since the bid phase, Paris 2024 has embraced its responsibilities by offering a model for different Games, more sustainable and just as spectacular, and is mobilising all the dynamics to support this approach. By developing and applying more responsible solutions in all areas of the organization aimed at reducing its climate impact, Paris 2024 aims to inspire and leave a sustainable legacy for the communities, sport and events.

Paris 2024 has pledged to halve carbon emissions compared with the average for previous Games (London 2012, Rio 2016).

Paris 2024 wants to propose a new standard for the organisation of sporting events, in line with the Paris Climate Agreement, adopted in 2015. To achieve this, Paris 2024 is taking action at every level. Paris 2024 is committing to :

- 95% of existing or temporary competition venues
- Catering with 2 times more plant-based food and 50% less of single plastic-use
- 100% of second life for furniture, equipment and temporary infrastructures

- 100% of renewable electricity for the Games venues Energy issues are also taken into account, as the sites are connected to the public electricity grid to avoid the use of generators and are supplied with 100% renewable electricity.
- The fleet of vehicles for athletes and accredited members of the public includes electric, hybrid and hydrogen-powered vehicles supplied by World Olympic and Paralympic Partner Toyota. To further reduce the carbon impact, the fleet used will be optimised, with 40% fewer vehicles than in previous editions of the Games.

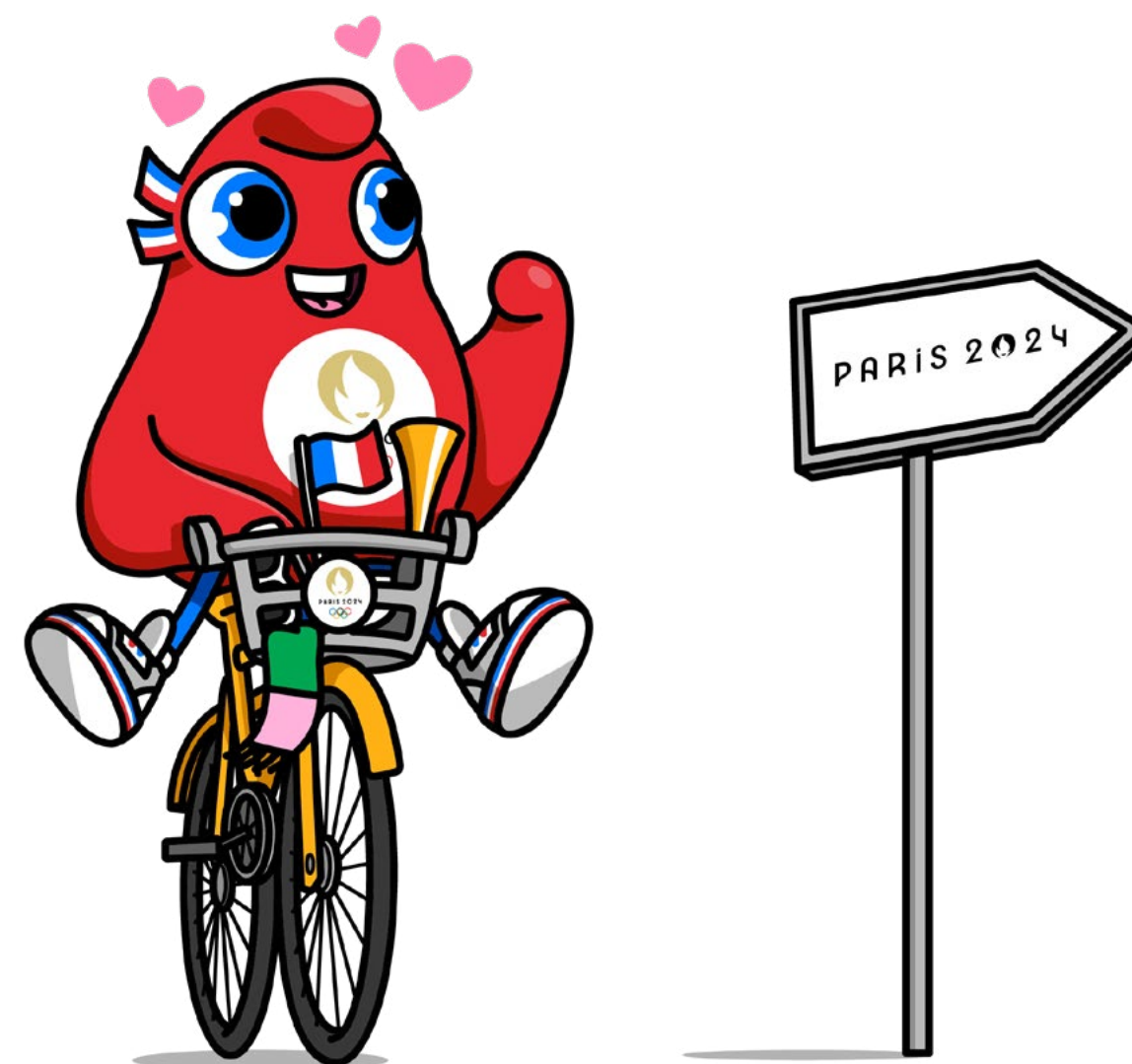
The olympic Village: a true showcase of solutions for the city of tomorrow, left as legacy a to Seine-Saint-Denis department

- Designed to be an eco-district, after the Games the Paralympic Village will be transformed into a new residential and business district, providing workplaces for 6,000 people and flats for as many.
- An example of low-carbon construction thanks to the use of wood, low-carbon concrete and reused materials.
- A future eco-neighbourhood adapted to tomorrow's climate (vegetation, cooling floors, etc.).
- Reused or recycled furniture, for which a second life is already planned for after the Games.
- The world's largest restaurant, with no single-use plastic bottles, 100% reusable crockery and more responsible food.
- Innovative and responsible energy solutions.

Everyone is involved in more responsible Games: how can you contribute?

Successfully delivering a more responsible Games is everyone's responsibility. At all the venues and in the co-host city, you have many opportunities to take action at your own level and help Paris 2024 achieve its goals so we can all be proud of our Games. That's why Paris 2024 is encouraging you to pick up a few eco-friendly habits:

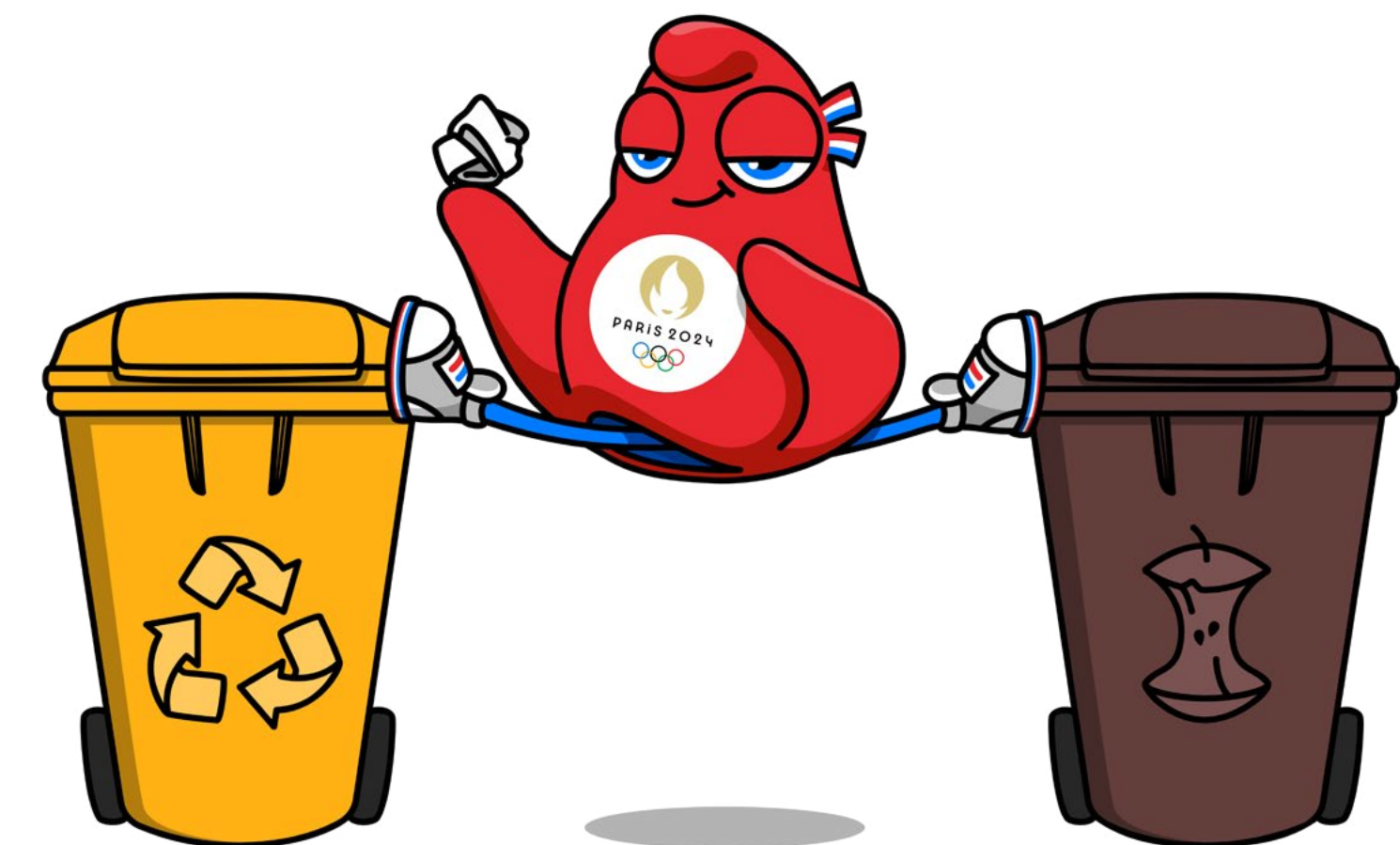

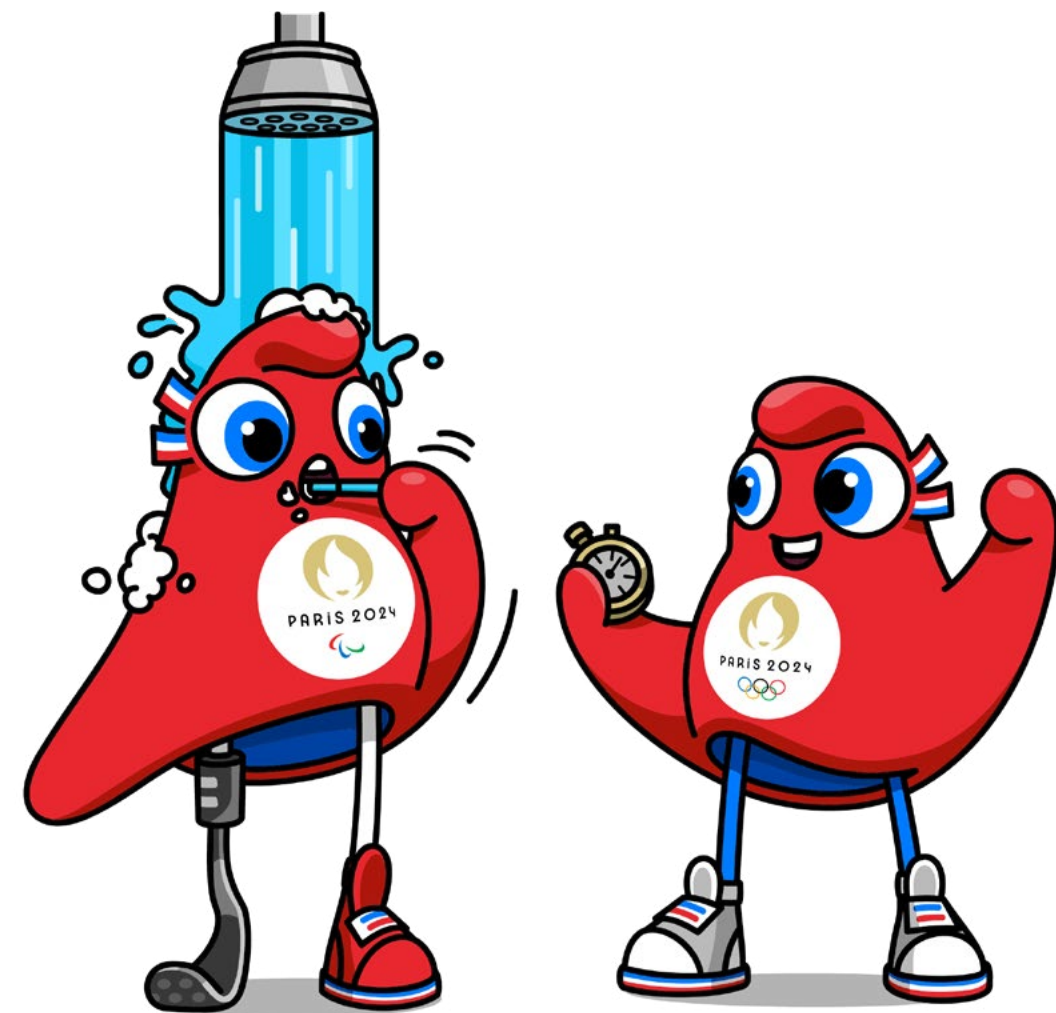
- Don't drop litter, and follow the sorting rules to recycle your waste.

11.4.1 GAMES MAP

11.4.2 THE TORCH RELAY

The Paralympic Torch Relay kicks off the return match and Paralympic celebrations. From 25 to 28 August 2024, 1,000 Forerunners will carry the Torch. These are people who live and breathe sport each day, people who are invested in the Paris 2024 Games, and people who are looking forward to welcoming and experiencing them. The Forerunners will rekindle the celebratory spirit of the Games and officially open the Paralympic celebrations, bearing a message full of enthusiasm:

“The Games are back!”

The Paralympic Torch Relay route

The Torch will be lit in Stoke Mandeville, the historic birthplace of Paralympic sport. After crossing the Channel Tunnel and arriving on the French coast in Calais, the Paralympic Flame will be split into 12 Flames that will journey to light up the whole of France. They will symbolise the energy of the 12 days of the first Summer Paralympic Games to be held in France, with the cauldron to be lit on 28 August 2024, followed by 11 days of competition. With the support of the regions involved and its Official Sponsors (Coca-Cola, Banque Populaire, Caisse d'Epargne, etc.), the 12 flames will pass through around fifty towns and cities in every region of France, converging on the Paris region before coming together in Paris.

11.4.3 CELEBRATIONS IN THE CITY

The Games Open Wide: the Paris 2024 celebrations

From 28 August 2024, throughout France, more than 180 local authorities involved with the Games project through the “Terre de Jeux 2024” programme will be opening the Clubs 2024. These Clubs 2024 will allow the public to watch the events on a giant screen free of charge, and provide opportunities to meet the athletes and share unique emotions. What’s more, with the Celebrations Kit, many public places such as restaurants, bars, retirement homes, sports clubs and leisure centres will also be decked out in the colours of the Games.

11.4.4 PARTNER AREAS (“SHOWCASING”)

The partners' areas are located in the heart of the city, in symbolic places, in close proximity to many of the competition sites for the para-cycling and para-triathlon events: the Champs-Élysées, the Berges de Seine and the foot of the Eiffel Tower.

During the Paralympic Games, the partners bring the area they occupy to life, offering an exceptional experience that connects with their own universe.

The partner areas are free to enter and open to all, ticket-holders and non-ticket-holders alike. These areas are generally open every day from 10 am to 10 pm. Some exceptions are possible, as road events may require temporary closures or changes to access arrangements.

These partner areas can be located on the Games Map, within the "Paralympic Games - Paris 2024" application, presented in [section 11.20. Useful applications for Smartphone](#).

11.4.5 VICTORY CEREMONIES

The aim of the victory ceremonies is to honour the athletes, recognising their extraordinary performances, while promoting the spirit of the Paralympic Movement and fair play. They are organised after the last event, directly on the competition venue, to celebrate the athletes who mount the podium by presenting them with medals and commemorative gifts. After the presentation of medals and ceremonial gifts, the victory ceremony is an opportunity to celebrate the nation of the winning athlete or team with the playing of its national anthem, while the national flags of the medal-winning athletes are raised. The first victory ceremony is scheduled for 29 August for the C4-5 Women's 500m Para-Cycling Time Trial at the Saint-Quentin-en-Yvelines Velodrome.

11.4.6 PARC DES NATIONS AT LA VILLETTE

An open-air sports hall, the Parc de La Villette will naturally be one of the iconic venues for the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games, with Club France and a host of French sports federations taking up residence in its main hall and on its lawns. The Dutch Paralympic Committee will also be setting up its hospitality house in the Park. La Villette will be open to all those who love sport and its values throughout the world, and who have an irresistible urge to celebrate the global event that is the Paralympic Games. 11.5

COMPLIANCE

11.5.1 GENERAL GUIDELINES

Paris 2024 is imposing the highest standards of integrity and transparency to deliver exemplary Games. On a day-to-day basis, these objectives accompany all the steps initiated by the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games Organising Committee.

11.5.2 SPORTS BETTING

As part of the fight against the manipulation of sporting competitions, it is forbidden to bet on all events (in accordance with the IPC and IOC Code of Ethics and the French Sports Code) or to ask third parties to do so on your behalf. The persons concerned by this rule are defined by the French Sports Code. This includes all athletes, sports and medical staff, but more generally all accredited persons. Checks are carried out to ensure compliance with these provisions.

11.5.3 PREVENTING AND RAISING AWARENESS OF SEXUAL AND GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

Paris 2024's goal is to create a safe, respectful and equal environment for everyone during the Games. We urge all participants to be mindful of their own behaviour and that of others. If you observe or witness violence of any kind, including sexual and gender-based violence, inappropriate behavior, degrading comments or any other form of discrimination, don't remain silent. Report them directly to a member of the Organising Committee, or online via the reporting platform which treats each case with the necessary confidentiality and sensitivity:

INSURANCE

As the organiser of the Games, Paris 2024 provides you with the following insurance cover:

11.6.1 MEDICAL AND REPATRIATION INSURANCE

Please refer to the information at the beginning of this [chapter 7 Medical services](#).

11.6.2 AUTOMOTIVE

The vehicles made available by Paris 2024 are covered by the following warranties:

- **Third-party liability:** covers damage caused to third parties (particularly passengers) in the event of an accident involving the insured vehicle.
- **Bodily injury to the driver:** this covers damage sustained by the driver of the vehicle, even if they are proven to have been at fault in the accident.

For vehicles made available by Paris 2024, details of warranties are available when the vehicle is made available.

Vehicles hired via RateCard are insured separately from the vehicles provided by Paris 2024. Details of the warranties for these vehicles are available in RateCard's general terms and conditions. For all inquiries, please contact: contact@ratecard.paris2024.org.

All other vehicles, such as your personal vehicles, are your responsibility and must at least be insured in accordance with current French legislation.

11.6.3 CIVIL LIABILITY

You are strongly advised to take out a "Civil Liability" insurance policy to cover damage of any kind caused to third parties (including bodily injury, material damage and consequential or non-consequential damage to bodily injury or material damage).

11.6.4 DAMAGE TO PROPERTY BELONGING TO THE PARALYMPIC FAMILY

You remain responsible for any damage to your personal belongings. We recommend that you take out appropriate insurance to cover the assets you are legally responsible for (computers, furniture, etc.).

GENERAL SAFETY AND SECURITY

The French government is the guarantor of safety and security during the Paralympic Games. In this capacity, the government coordinates all safety-related issues, as well as emergency services.

Paris 2024 is responsible for the design, implementation and execution of security measures at competition and non-competition sites. In this context, Paris 2024 has joined forces with the relevant national security organisations to integrate the most effective security systems within the competition venues and other official sites.

11.7.1 VENUE SECURITY GUIDELINES

The Préfecture de Police de Paris has set up a "State" perimeter to ensure the safety of spectators and local residents. Three perimeters co-exist, as you can see on the map below:

- The diversions perimeter (in blue),
- The restriction perimeter (in red),
- The protection perimeter - SILT (in grey).

Grey: this is the **protection perimeter (or SILT - Sécurité insécurité et lutte contre le terrorisme [Security, Insecurity and Counter-Terrorism])** used during major events, which encompasses the organisers' perimeter and the competition site.

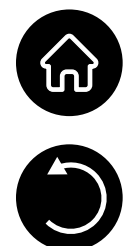
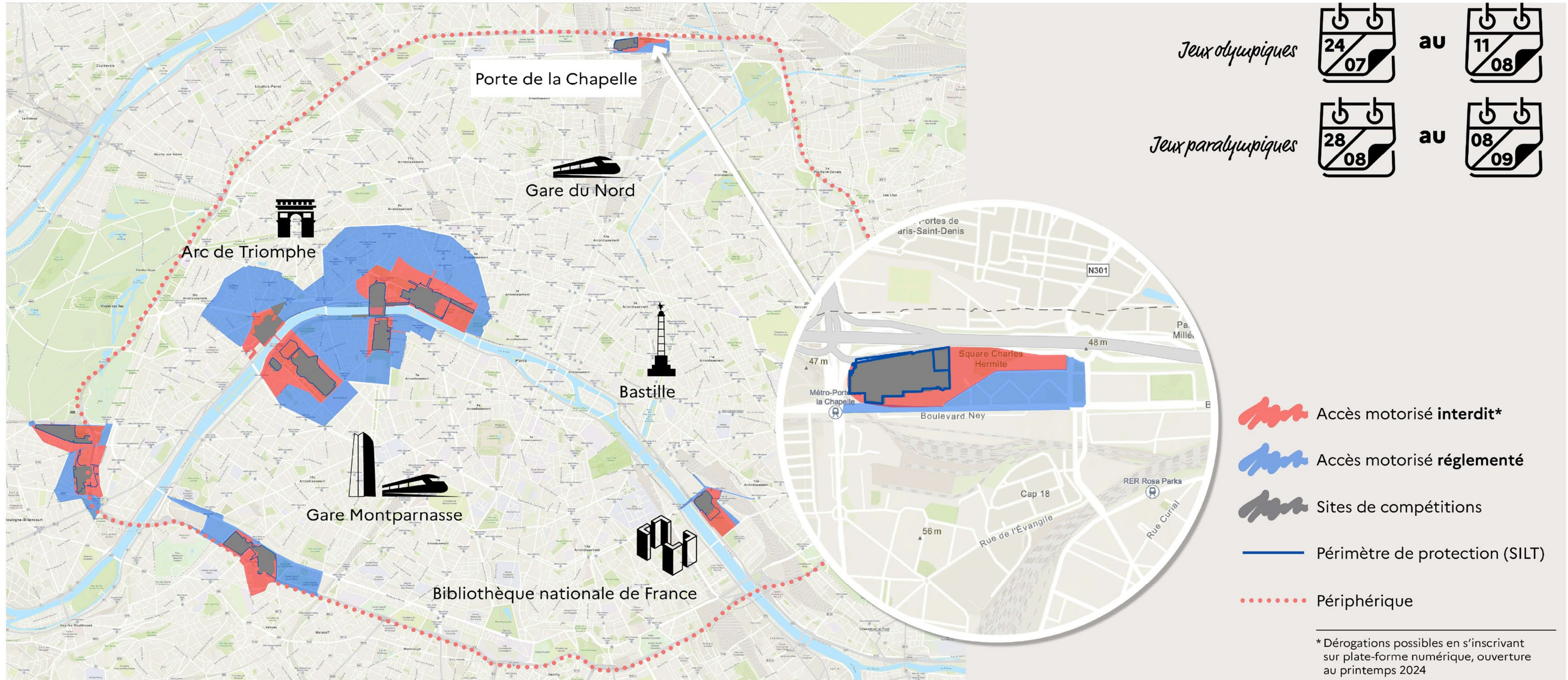
Only ticketed spectators and persons accredited by the COJOP will have access, as well as local residents, who may be affected.

To gain access to this perimeter, pat-downs and searches of bags and luggage are carried out.

Red: this perimeter **prohibits motorised road traffic**, except in the case of specific exemptions. Your accreditation constitutes such an exemption and allows you to enter this perimeter on foot or by bicycle.

The red perimeter has two specific objectives: terrorism reduction, and to guarantee the safety of the public entering or leaving a site, and of local residents.

Blue: the blue **perimeter regulates motorised road traffic**, reducing and diverting motorised traffic around red perimeters. Checks may be carried out at crossing points by the authorities, with verification of the legitimacy of the crossing. However, your accreditation allows you to enter this perimeter.

We recommend a number of good safety practices to help you make the most of your stay:

- Keep your personal belongings in a safe place, especially your identity papers and travel documents.
- Label your luggage and do not leave it unattended.
- Do not leave any personal belongings in sight inside your vehicle.
- Use cash machines located in public places, or inside a bank or shop.
- Avoid using unsecured public Wi-Fi networks and be careful not to post confidential information about the Games on your social networks.
- Follow the advice of the authorities
- Be vigilant and aware of your surroundings, and report anything suspicious to the authorities.
- Be ready to react by learning the emergency numbers you need: 15 to contact the SAMU (Emergency Medical Service), 17 to contact the police, 18 to contact the fire brigade, or the European emergency number 112. More information on emergency numbers can be found in the **section 11.19. Emergency contacts**.

11.7.2 VENUE SECURITY

Venue inspection and lockdown

The Paralympic Villages, all the competition venues and the majority of the training venues are subject to a safety inspection by the State's specialist services and to a lock-down period before the Games. This inspection verifies the absence of any prohibited or dangerous items that could pose a threat to safety and security.

During the lockdown period, all security and safety procedures are put in place, and access control is activated with the support of specific technological means, with the exception of facial recognition, which is prohibited by French law. From the time of the security inspection, no person, vehicle or equipment may enter the sites without accreditation (or anything else authorising access) and without passing the appropriate security checks.

To gain access to the sites, after your accreditation has been checked, you and your luggage will undergo a personal inspection. An adapted procedure is available for people whose age, mobility or medical reasons so require. For more information on prohibited or restricted items on-site, please refer to the [**section 8.6: Prohibited, restricted and authorised items on the various sites.**](#)

SMOKING POLICY

Smoking is prohibited on the competition and non-competition venues, in their car parks and in the official hotel.

Exceptions are applied to certain rooms and areas of the official hotel (balconies, terraces) that do not fall under the jurisdiction

of Paris 2024, where the hotel's own regulations apply.

Smoking is prohibited in the parking lots within the safety perimeters. Heated tobacco and electronic tobacco products are also prohibited.

CURRENCY AND EXCHANGE MACHINES

The currency used in France is the euro (symbol: €; ISO code: EUR).

There are a large number of banks in Paris, both French and foreign. They are generally open from 9 am to 5 pm, Monday to Friday. Some branches may close at lunchtime, between 12:30 and 2 pm.

Although some banks will accept your currency in exchange for euros, for a fee, you can also find bureaux de change that specialise in this type of transaction. Don't forget to bring your ID.

With your bank card, you can withdraw euros 24 hours a day from the numerous cash machines. Most international bank cards are accepted.

On official competition and non-competition sites, only electronic payments made with a VISA card are accepted. Please bring cash if you don't have a VISA card.

In France, prices include tax and service, the latter representing around 15% of the total price. If the service has been particularly good, you can leave a tip to show your satisfaction. It usually amounts to 5 to 10% of the bill. However, it is not mandatory.

MOBILE PHONES

Paris 2024 does not provide mobile phones. Please find below the information you need to purchase a phone or SIM card in Paris.

11.14.1 GETTING A PHONE

Before you leave for Paris, check with your operator to find out whether your phone is technically and commercially compatible with French networks, and how you will be billed for calls you receive from your country and/or make (local or international). To surf the Internet and send messages from your smartphone, you need to activate data roaming (unless you're on a Wi-Fi network). This function, accessible from your phone's settings, may incur charges. Don't forget that you may need a plug adapter for your laptop charger.

If you want to buy a phone in Paris, the four major national telephone operators - Orange, SFR, Bouygues Telecom and Free Mobile - have a number of sales outlets. Supermarkets and electronics stores can also offer you a selection of cell phones.

11.14.2 GETTING A SIM CARD

In Paris, you can buy a SIM card very easily in the shops of the main network provider or in electronics shops, where you can select a package to suit your needs. Most department stores, newsagents and tobacconists sell prepaid SIM cards.

Purchasing an eSIM is also possible, whether through mobile operator stores, via online purchase using platforms such as eSIM.net, or via dedicated operator applications. The advantage of eSIM lies in its flexibility, eliminating the need for a physical SIM card and enabling multiple numbers to be shared on the same device. However, not all phones support eSIM, so make sure your device is compatible.

WEATHER CONDITIONS

The climate in Paris is temperate-oceanic, with relatively hot summers. Rain showers are frequent throughout the year. Based on statistics from recent years, you can expect an average maximum temperature of around 25°C during the day and a minimum temperature of around 15°C in the evening. Relative humidity averages around 65% during this period. Average monthly rainfall in July and August is 60 millimetres.



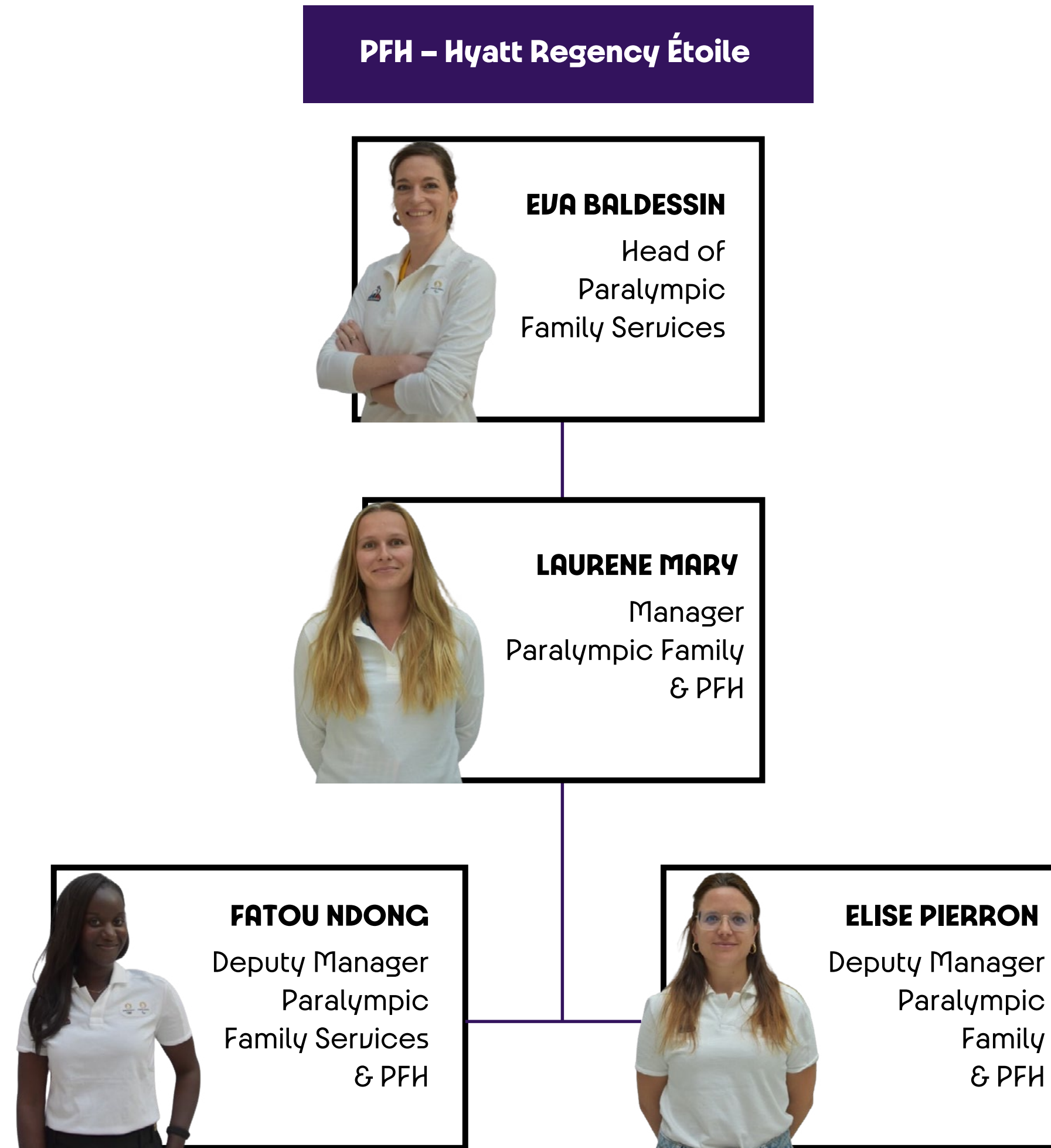

- Wi-Fi coverage is available in areas reserved for the Paralympic Family at competition venues, ceremony sites, certain common areas of the PFH and other official non-competition sites;
- The use of unauthorised Wi-Fi transmission devices is prohibited. Users must ensure that personal hotspots and tethering are deactivated at all times to minimise interference with the Wi-Fi Internet access service;

Authentication is based on personal identification information

1. The device must be connected to the Wi-Fi network using the PSK password supplied on the site.
2. The web browser opens (proxy must be disabled).

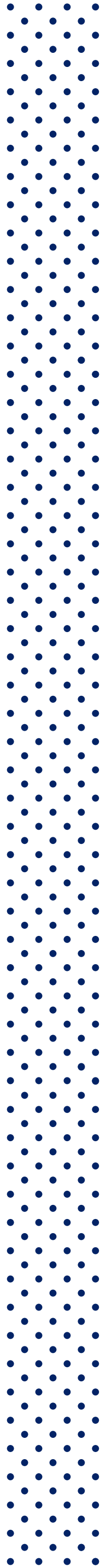
